## What You'll Need


1 navy print square, 9" × 9";  
cut into:  
2 squares, 3" × 3"; cut in  
half diagonally to make 4  
triangles for A1  
4 rectangles, 2" × 4", for B2  
8 cream print rectangles, 1" × 3",  
for A2 and B3  
1 green print square, 9" × 9";  
cut into:  
4 rectangles, 2" × 4", for A3  
2 squares, 3" × 3"; cut in  
half diagonally to make 4  
triangles for B4  
4 navy tone on tone rectangles,  
 $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ , for A4  
4 blue floral rectangles,  
 $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ , for B1  
2 red print squares,  $1\frac{3}{8}'' \times 1\frac{3}{8}''$ ; cut  
in half diagonally for C  
Paper for foundation piecing

## Assembly


Press all seam allowances in the direction indicated by the arrows. Refer to "Foundation Piecing" on page 136 as needed.


1. Make four copies each of foundation patterns A and B on pattern sheet 4.
2. Piece each A pattern in numerical order, beginning with a navy print for piece A1. Trim and press each seam as a new piece is added. After adding the last piece, trim around the unit along the outer lines, which includes a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.
3. Repeat the process for each B section.

4. Stitch section A to B and press. Sew a C triangle to each A/B unit and press. Make four block quarters.



5. Lay out the block quarters and join them into rows and press. Join the rows; press to make a  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " block. Carefully remove the foundation paper and press again.





Make 4 copies of each.
