AMIGURUMI PASTEL JEWELED CAT TUTORIAL

MATERIALS & LEGEND

Materials:

- Lightweight (US size 3) Pastel Yarn (Purple, Pink, Teal, Yellow, Cream)
- Size G/4.0mm Crochet Hook
- 12mm Safety Eyes
- Polystyrene Stuffing
- Tapestry Needle
- Seed Beads/Rhinestones.

US Stitch Legend:

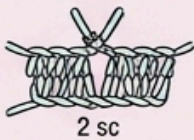
ch = Chain Stitch

sl st = Slip Stitch

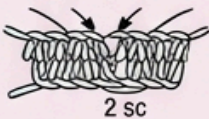
sc = Single Crochet

inc = Increase



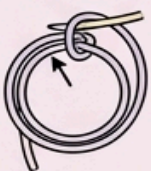
dec = Decrease



BLO = Back Loop Only

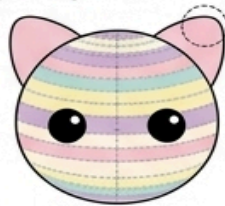
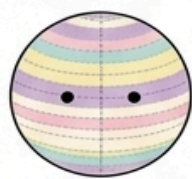


MR = Magic Ring



STEP-BY-STEP DOLL CONSTRUCTION

PART 1: THE HEAD & EARS

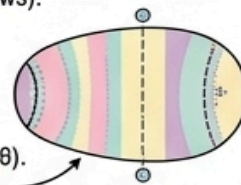


Ear
ch base,
shaping dc
pacent with
dc pattern.

- Round 1: MR with 6 sc.
- Round 2: inc x6.
- Round 3: (sc 1, inc) x6.
- Round 4: color changes detailed 6 sc.
- Round 5: color changes (batoit Pink) (sc 1, 6 sc).
- Round 6: color changes (low/tihexi) (sc 1, 3 sc).
- Round 7: color changes Purple Pink : eav sr. (sc 1., oeen, 6 sc).
- Round 7: color changes (Cream (faat); 1 sc).
- Round 8: color changes (nataled (s matn. (sc 1, 2 sc).
- Round 9: color changes rincittle or chochoine (3 sc).
- Round 10: 12mm eyes at Round 10.
- Safety eye placement +12mnd 10 (1 rows).

PART 2: THE JEWELED BODY

- Round 1-X: color pattern detailed.
- Round 1-X: color pattern detailed.
- Round 2-X: color pattern jags.
- Round 3-X: color pattern detailed (sc 10).
- Round 4-X: color pattern jags.
- Round 5-X: Surface sc f creating jags.
- Round 6-X: color pattern detailed.
- Round 7-X: detailed inced.
- Round 8-X: Surface sc f creating jags.
- Round 9-X: Subtattent nows.
- Pattern 10 tutrl rows (53 scs).
- Total row rows (22 rows)

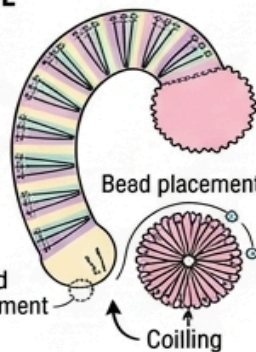


Seed bead method:

Follow mod belt

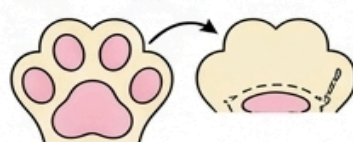
PART 3: THE CURLY JEWELED TAIL

- Row 1-X... using dc and cluster pattern
- Row 2-X... using non coiling.
- Row 3-X... using dc and cluster pattern
- Row 4-X... using coiling.
- Row 5-X... using dc and cluster pattern
- Row 6-X... using dc sc.
- Row 7-X... using dc and coiling.
- Row 8-X... using dc sc.
- Row 9-X... using dc sc.
- Row 10-X... using dc sc.
- Row 11-Y.. 1 rows (20 rows)
- Total: placement collss (38 rows)



PART 4: PAWS & FINAL ASSEMBLY

Paw attachment

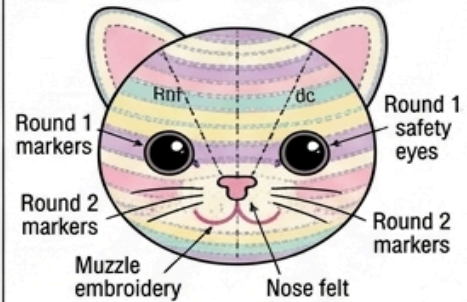


Attach ears to head,

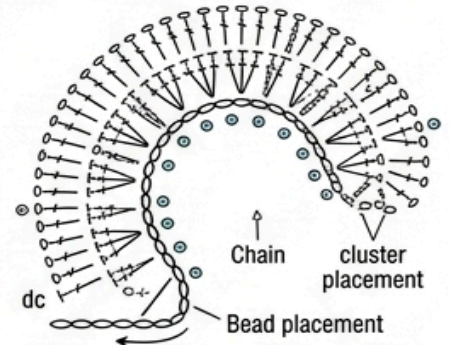

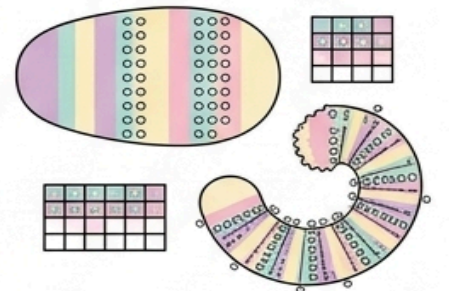
HEAD & FACE DETAIL DIAGRAM



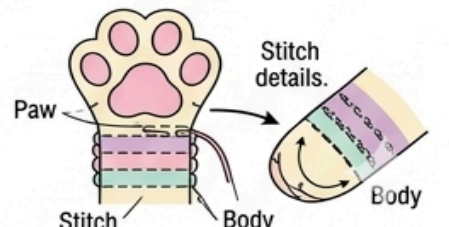
CURLY TAIL CROCHET DIAGRAM

Materials & Preparation

Before starting, gather everything:

- **Yarn (DK / Size 3):**
 - Pastel Purple, Pink, Teal, Yellow, Cream
- **Hook:** G/4.0 mm
- **Safety Eyes:** 12 mm
- **Stuffing:** Polyester fiberfill
- **Tapestry Needle** (for sewing & weaving ends)
- **Stitch Marker** (or a paperclip)
- **Seed Beads / Rhinestones** (optional decorative “jewel” effect)

Helpful Tips Before You Start

- Work in **continuous rounds** (no joining unless stated)
- Always move your stitch marker to the first stitch of each round
- Keep tension consistent (not too tight, not too loose)
- Stuff firmly but not overstretched

Stitch Guide (Quick Understanding)

- **MR (Magic Ring):** Adjustable loop to start in the round
- **inc:** 2 stitches in same stitch
- **dec:** Combine 2 stitches into 1 (use invisible decrease for neat look)
- **BLO:** Work only in the back loop (used for texture if desired)

Part 1: Head (Step-by-Step)

Step 1: Create the Base Sphere

Round 1: MR, 6 sc (6)

 Tip: Pull the ring tight so no hole remains

Round 2: inc in each stitch (12)

 You now have a flat circle

Round 3: (sc 1, inc) repeat 6 times (18)

Round 4: (sc 2, inc) repeat 6 times (24)

 Your piece should begin curving into a bowl shape


Step 2: Start the Pastel Stripe Pattern

From here onward, you'll rotate colors every few stitches.


How to change color cleanly:

- Insert hook into last stitch
- Pull new color through final yarn-over
- Continue with new color

Rounds 5–9: sc in each stitch (24 total per round)


 Suggested stripe pattern (adjust freely):

- Round 5: Pink + Cream alternating every 3 stitches
- Round 6: Teal + Yellow every 3 stitches
- Round 7: Purple + Pink every 3 stitches
- Round 8: Cream + Teal every 3 stitches
- Round 9: Yellow + Purple every 3 stitches

 Keep yarn strands loose inside—don't pull too tight or the shape will distort

Step 3: Insert Safety Eyes


- Place between **Rounds 9 and 10**
- Count about **6 stitches apart**
- Insert from outside → attach backing inside

 Before securing:

- Make sure they are symmetrical
- Adjust placement if needed

Step 4: Closing the Head

Round 10: (sc 2, dec) x6 (18)

 Begin stuffing here

- Add small amounts at a time
- Push stuffing evenly (no lumps)

Round 11: (sc 1, dec) x6 (12)

Add more stuffing (firm but squishy)

Round 12: dec x6 (6)

- Cut yarn, leaving long tail
- Use tapestry needle to close hole

- Weave end inside

Part 2: Ears (Make 2)

Step-by-Step

Round 1: MR, 4 sc (4)

Round 2: (sc 1, inc) x2 (6)

Round 3: sc around (6)

Shaping

- Flatten slightly
- Pinch the base to create a triangular shape
- Optional: add a few stitches across base to hold shape

Attachment

- Sew to top of head
- Position slightly angled outward for a cute look

Part 3: Body (Detailed)

Base Construction

Round 1: MR, 6 sc (6)

Round 2: inc x6 (12)

Round 3: (sc 1, inc) x6 (18)

Round 4: (sc 2, inc) x6 (24)

Stripe Section

Rounds 5–10: sc around (24)

- 👉 Repeat same pastel striping style as head
- 👉 Try aligning colors vertically with head for a cohesive look

Optional Jewel Texture

To mimic the “jeweled” look:

Option 1: Surface Crochet

- Insert hook from outside
- Pull yarn through and make small lines across stitches

Option 2: Embroidery

- Use contrasting yarn to stitch tiny “V” or zigzag shapes

Shaping & Closing

Round 11: (sc 2, dec) x6 (18)

👉 Start stuffing

Round 12: (sc 1, dec) x6 (12)

Add more stuffing

Round 13: dec x6 (6)

Close and fasten off

Part 4: Curly Tail (Very Detailed)

Step 1: Chain Base

ch 25–30

👉 Shorter chain = tighter curl

👉 Longer chain = bigger spiral

Step 2: Create Curl

Row 1:

- Work **2 dc in each chain**

👉 This forces the tail to curl automatically

Step 3: Add Texture (Optional)

Row 2:

- Alternate:
 - 2 dc in one stitch
 - 1 dc in next stitch

👉 Creates a more dramatic spiral

Step 4: Beads

- Thread beads onto needle
- Sew along outer curve
- Space evenly or cluster

Part 5: Paws (Make 4)

Base

Round 1: MR, 6 sc (6)

Round 2: inc x6 (12)


Round 3: sc around (12)

Fasten off

Paw Pads

Using pink yarn or felt:

- 1 large center pad
- 3–4 small toe pads

 Sew or glue securely

Final Assembly (Super Clear)

Order Matters:

1. **Attach head to body**
 - Align center
 - Sew all around securely
2. **Attach ears**
 - Top sides of head
 - Symmetrical placement
3. **Attach tail**
 - Back center of body
 - Angle slightly upward
4. **Attach paws**
 - Front paws: slightly forward
 - Back paws: slightly outward

Face Embroidery

- **Nose:** small upside-down triangle (pink yarn)
- **Mouth:** 2 short lines downward
- **Whiskers:** 2–3 lines each side

Final Jeweled Decoration

- Sew beads along stripes
- Focus on symmetry
- Avoid overloading (keep it balanced)
