


🌿 Crochet Guide: Blossoming Vine Wall Hanging (Full Tutorial)

This step-by-step guide walks you through creating a beautiful crocheted vine wall hanging with leaves, flowers, and a decorative tassel. It follows standard US crochet terminology and is designed so beginners and experienced crocheters alike can complete it successfully.



PART 1: ASSEMBLING THE BASE & VINE NETWORK



Step 1: The Wooden Dowel Support.



Step 2: Start the Central Vine.




Step 3: Build the Vine Branches.



PRINCIPAL US CROCHET TERMS & METHODS

Stitches:

- Single Crochet (sc)
- Half Double Crochet (hdc)
- Double Crochet (dc)
- Treble Crochet (tr)
- Slip Stitch (sl st)
- Chain Stitch (ch)



Color Key:

- Dark Green Yarn (DGY)
- Bright Red Yarn (BRY)
- Yellow Yarn (YY)
- Twine (T)
- Wooden Dowel (W)


PART 2: CROCHETING LEAVES & FLOWERS

A. LARGE LEAVES (DGY)



Instructions:

- Row 1: ch1, sc around.
- Rows 2-3: Increase sc to create width.
- Rows 4-5: dc for length.
- Rows 6+: tr and tr2tog for pointed shape.




B. SMALL LEAVES (DGY)



Instructions:

- Start ch3.
- Row 1: hdc in ch.
- Row 2: sc decrease to shape.



C. BLOSSOM FLOWERS (BRY w/ YY centers)

C1. Centers (YY):
Work 3 sc into a magic ring.
Pull tight.


C2. Petals (BRY):
(Join BRY to center).

- Round 1: [sc, ch2, 3 dc, ch2] repeat 5 times for a 5-petal flower. sl st to first sc.




PART 3: ATTACHING ELEMENTS & THE FINAL VINE


Step 4: Sew Elements to Branches.

Materials You'll Need

- Dark Green Yarn (for vines and leaves)
- Bright Red Yarn (for flowers)
- Yellow Yarn (for flower centers)
- Twine (for hanging and bow)
- Wooden Dowel (approx. 12–16 inches long)
- Crochet Hook (recommended: 3.5 mm – 4.5 mm / E–G)
- Yarn Needle
- Scissors



Basic Crochet Stitches & Abbreviations (US Terms)

- sc = Single Crochet
- hdc = Half Double Crochet
- dc = Double Crochet
- tr = Treble Crochet
- sl st = Slip Stitch
- ch = Chain



Step 1: Prepare the Wooden Dowel Support

Cut a piece of twine and tie it securely to both ends of the wooden dowel to create a hanging loop. This will support your entire piece, so make sure it's tight and balanced.



Step 2: Start the Central Vine

Using dark green yarn:

1. Make a slip knot.
2. Chain (ch) a long foundation (about 16 inches or desired length).
3. This chain becomes your central vine.

Tip: Keep your tension consistent so the vine doesn't curl too tightly.



Step 3: Build the Vine Branches

To create branching vines:

1. Work along your main chain.
2. At desired points, chain 5–10 stitches outward.
3. Turn your work.
4. Crochet back along the chain using single crochet (sc).
5. Slip stitch (sl st) back into the main vine.

Repeat this process to create multiple branches of varying lengths. This gives the piece a natural, cascading look 🌿

Step 4: Plan Your Layout

Before attaching leaves and flowers, lay your vine flat and visualize placement:

- Alternate branch lengths
- Leave space for flowers
- Keep symmetry loose and organic

Step 5: Crochet Large Leaves

Using dark green yarn:

1. Row 1: Chain 1, work single crochet (sc) around an oval shape.
2. Rows 2–3: Increase using sc to widen the leaf.
3. Rows 4–5: Use double crochet (dc) to add length.
4. Row 6+: Use treble crochet (tr) and decrease stitches to create a pointed tip.

Fasten off and leave a tail for sewing.

Step 6: Crochet Small Leaves

Using dark green yarn:

1. Chain 3.
2. Row 1: Work half double crochet (hdc) into each chain.
3. Row 2: Use single crochet (sc) decreases to taper the shape.

Fasten off and leave a tail.

Step 7: Crochet Flower Centers

Using yellow yarn:

1. Make a magic ring.
2. Work 3 single crochet (sc) into the ring.
3. Pull tight and slip stitch to close.

Step 8: Crochet Flower Petals

Switch to red yarn:

1. Join yarn to the yellow center.
2. Round 1:
 - [sc, ch 2, 3 dc, ch 2] in same stitch
 - Repeat 5 times to create 5 petals
3. Slip stitch to first sc to finish.

Fasten off and leave a tail.

Step 9: Attach Leaves and Flowers

Using a yarn needle:

- Sew leaves along the branches (mix large and small)
- Attach flowers in clusters for a fuller look 
- Secure everything tightly but neatly

Tip: Work from top to bottom for best balance.

Step 10: Create the Final Central Vine Extension

At the bottom of your main vine:

1. Continue chaining downward.
2. Add small leaves if desired.
3. This section will lead into the tassel.

Step 11: Make the Tassel with Bow

Tassel:

1. Wrap yarn around your hand or a small book 20–30 times.
2. Tie at the top.
3. Cut the bottom loops.
4. Wrap a small piece of yarn around the top to form the tassel head.

Bow:

1. Use twine to create a simple bow.
2. Tie it around the top of the tassel.

Attach the tassel securely to the bottom of the vine.

Step 12: Final Assembly

- Tie or sew the top of your vine to the wooden dowel
- Adjust spacing of branches, leaves, and flowers
- Trim any loose ends

Final Result

You now have a stunning handmade blossoming vine wall hanging featuring:

- Flowing green vines 
- Layered leaves 
- Bright red flowers with yellow centers 
- Decorative tassel and bow 

Tips for Success

- Keep stitches consistent in tension
- Don't overcrowd elements—let the design breathe
- Customize colors for your own style
- Block pieces lightly if needed for shape
