

Crochet Coffee Cup Coaster Pattern

US Crochet Terms – Based on the Diagram

Skill Level: Intermediate

Finished Size: approximately 18–22 cm (7–8.5 inches) wide

This decorative **coffee cup shaped coaster** is worked starting from a **circular base (saucer)** and then building the **cup body and handle** using shaped rows and decorative edging. It is perfect for **table decor, coffee lovers, gifts, or kitchen accessories**.

YARN COLOR CODE:

Thread A: Cream

Thread B: Coffee & Granola (††)

Thread C: Teal green (corr 1, pbt in back loop)

Materials

Recommended yarn:

- Cotton yarn (worsted weight)

Suggested colors:

- Cream – cup and saucer base
- Brown – coffee detail
- Teal or green – decorative edging

Hook size:

- 3.5 mm – 4.5 mm crochet hook

Tools:

- Yarn needle
 - Stitch markers
 - Scissors
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Abbreviations (US Terms)

MR – magic ring

ch – chain

sl st – slip stitch

sc – single crochet

hdc – half double crochet

dc – double crochet

tr – treble crochet

inc – increase (2 stitches in one stitch)

st – stitch

Part 1 – Saucer Base

Using **cream yarn**

Round 1

MR, 12 dc into ring.

Join with sl st. (12)

Round 2

Ch 2, *2 dc in each stitch around.*

Join. (24)

Round 3

Ch 2, *1 dc, inc* repeat around.

Join. (36)

Round 4

Ch 2, *2 dc, inc* repeat around.

Join. (48)

Round 5

Ch 2, dc around.

This forms the flat **saucer base**.

Part 2 – Saucer Expansion

Round 6

Ch 2, *3 dc, inc* repeat around.

Round 7

Dc evenly around.

Round 8

Ch 2, *4 dc, inc* repeat around.

Continue until saucer measures **about 18–20 cm**.

Part 3 – Cup Base

Attach yarn slightly above center of the saucer.

Round 1

MR, 12 dc.

Round 2

1 dc, inc repeat around.

Round 3

Dc evenly around.

Round 4

Work **dc in back loops only** to create the cup wall effect.

Part 4 – Cup Body

Continue working **dc stitches in spiral rounds**.

Add small increases every few stitches to keep the shape slightly wider at the top.

Work approximately **5–6 rounds** until the cup height looks proportional.

Part 5 – Coffee Surface

Using **brown yarn**

Attach yarn inside the cup.

Round

Work **hdc stitches evenly across the top opening**.

This creates the look of **coffee inside the cup**.

Part 6 – Cup Handle

Attach yarn to the side of the cup.

Row 1

Ch 8.

Row 2

Sc in 2nd chain from hook and across.

Attach the end to the cup using sl st.

Work **sc around the handle edge** to strengthen it.

Part 7 – Decorative Edge

Using **teal yarn**

Attach to saucer edge.

Round

Skip 2 stitches, 5 dc in next stitch, skip 2 stitches, sl st in next stitch

Repeat around entire saucer edge.

This forms the **scalloped decorative border**.

Part 8 – Textured Edge Detail

Optional step for extra texture.

Work in **back loops only**:

sc, ch 2, sc into each scallop.

This creates a raised decorative effect.

Finishing

- Weave in all yarn ends
 - Lightly steam block if needed
 - Make sure coaster lies flat
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Tips

- Cotton yarn works best for absorbent coasters.
 - Use contrasting colors for a stronger cup shape effect.
 - Tight stitches help the coaster keep its form.
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Optional Variations

You can customize the coaster with:

- Latte foam embroidery
- Heart latte art
- Different cup colors
- Larger mug version
