

Crochet Coffee Cup Coaster Pattern

CROCHET COFFEE CUP & SAUCER STEP-BY-STEP TUTORIAL



FINISHED SIZE

Cup: about 4.5 in (11.5 cm) wide
Saucer: about 6 in (15 cm) wide

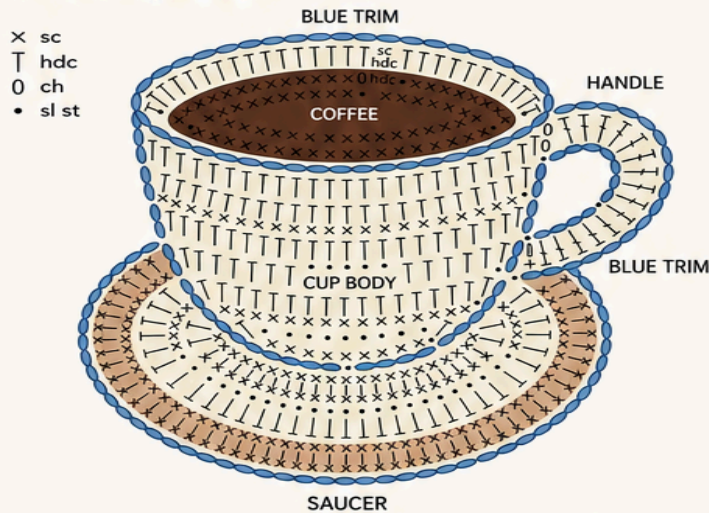
MATERIALS

- Worsted weight cotton yarn
- Colors:
Cream (cup body)
Brown (coffee)
Tan (saucer)
Blue (trim)
- Crochet hook: 4.0 mm (G-6)
- Yarn needle
- Scissors

ABBREVIATIONS (US TERMS)

ch	chain
sc	single crochet
hdc	half double crochet
sl st	slip stitch
st(s)	stitch(es)
()	work instructions in parentheses into same st
* *	repeat instructions between asterisks as indicated

1. PATTERN OVERVIEW



2. HOW TO READ THE CHART

- Work in continuous rounds (spiral).
- Do not join rounds unless stated.
- Use a stitch marker to mark the first stitch of each round.
- Follow the symbols and colors to complete each part.

3. STITCH GUIDE (US TERMS)

CHAIN (ch)



Yarn over, pull through loop on hook.

SINGLE CROCHET (sc)



Insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through both loops.

HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (hdc)



Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through all 3 loops.

SLIP STITCH (sl st)



Insert hook, yarn over, pull through both the stitch and loop on hook.

4. STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS

A. COFFEE (BROWN)

Start with brown yarn.

Rnd	Stitches	Instructions
1	6 sc	in magic ring (6)
2	2 sc in each st (12)	
3	(1 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep around (18)	
4	(2 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep around (24)	
5	(3 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep around (30)	
6	(4 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep around (36)	
7	(5 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep around (42)	
8	(6 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep around (48)	
9	(7 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep around (54)	
10	(8 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep around (60)	

Fasten off.

B. CUP BODY (CREAM)

Join cream yarn in any st of Round 10 (coffee edge).

Rnd	Stitches	Instructions
1	60 hdc	in BLO around (60)
2	60 hdc	around (60)
3	(9 hdc, 2 hdc in next st) rep (66)	
4	(10 hdc, 2 hdc in next st) rep (72)	
5	(11 hdc, 2 hdc in next st) rep (78)	
6	(12 hdc, 2 hdc in next st) rep (84)	
7	84 hdc	around (84)
8	84 hdc	around (84)
9	84 hdc	around (84)

Fasten off.

C. HANDLE (CREAM)

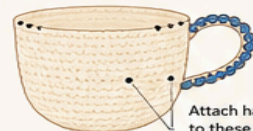
Work on the side of the cup.

Ch 14.

Row 1: Skip 2 ch from hook, 12 sc, sl st in next st.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, 12 sc, sl st in next st.

Fasten off. Attach both ends to the cup with sl st (see diagram).



Attach handle to these points

D. SAUCER (TAN & CREAM)

Start with tan yarn.

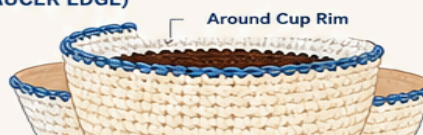
Rnd	Stitches	Instructions
1	6 sc	in magic ring (6)
2	2 sc in each st (12)	
3	(1 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep (18)	
4	(2 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep (24)	
5	(3 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep (30)	
6	(4 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep (36)	
7	36 sc	around (36)
8	(5 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep (42)	
9	42 sc	around (42)
10	(6 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep (48)	
11	48 sc	around (48)
12	(7 sc, 2 sc in next st) rep (54)	
13	54 sc	around (54)

Fasten off.

5. BLUE TRIM (BOTH CUP RIM, HANDLE & SAUCER EDGE)

Join blue yarn with sl st.

- Work sc evenly around the cup rim.
- Work sc around the handle.
- Work sc around the edge of the saucer.
- Join with sl st and fasten off.

6. ASSEMBLY

- Weave in all ends.
- Block gently if needed to even out the shape.
- Your cup and saucer are ready!



TIPS

- Use cotton yarn for best shape and durability.
- Keep your stitches even.
- Don't pull too tight.
- Enjoy your crochet time!



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Crochet Coffee Cup & Saucer Coaster Pattern



Enjoy creating this charming **Crochet Coffee Cup & Saucer Coaster**, a delightful project inspired by a classic cup of freshly brewed coffee. Designed as a layered coaster, this pattern features a realistic coffee surface, a cozy mug with a curved handle, a decorative contrasting trim, and a matching saucer. Each section is crocheted separately before being assembled, making it easy to shape every piece while closely following the original crochet chart.

Whether you're making a thoughtful handmade gift, decorating your coffee station, or adding a unique touch to your home décor, this project is both practical and fun to crochet.

Skill Level

Easy to Intermediate

This pattern uses only basic crochet stitches and simple shaping techniques. If you know how to crochet in rounds and work basic increases, you'll be able to complete this project with confidence.

Finished Size

Approximately:

- Coffee Cup: 4½ inches (11.5 cm) wide
- Saucer: 6 inches (15 cm) wide

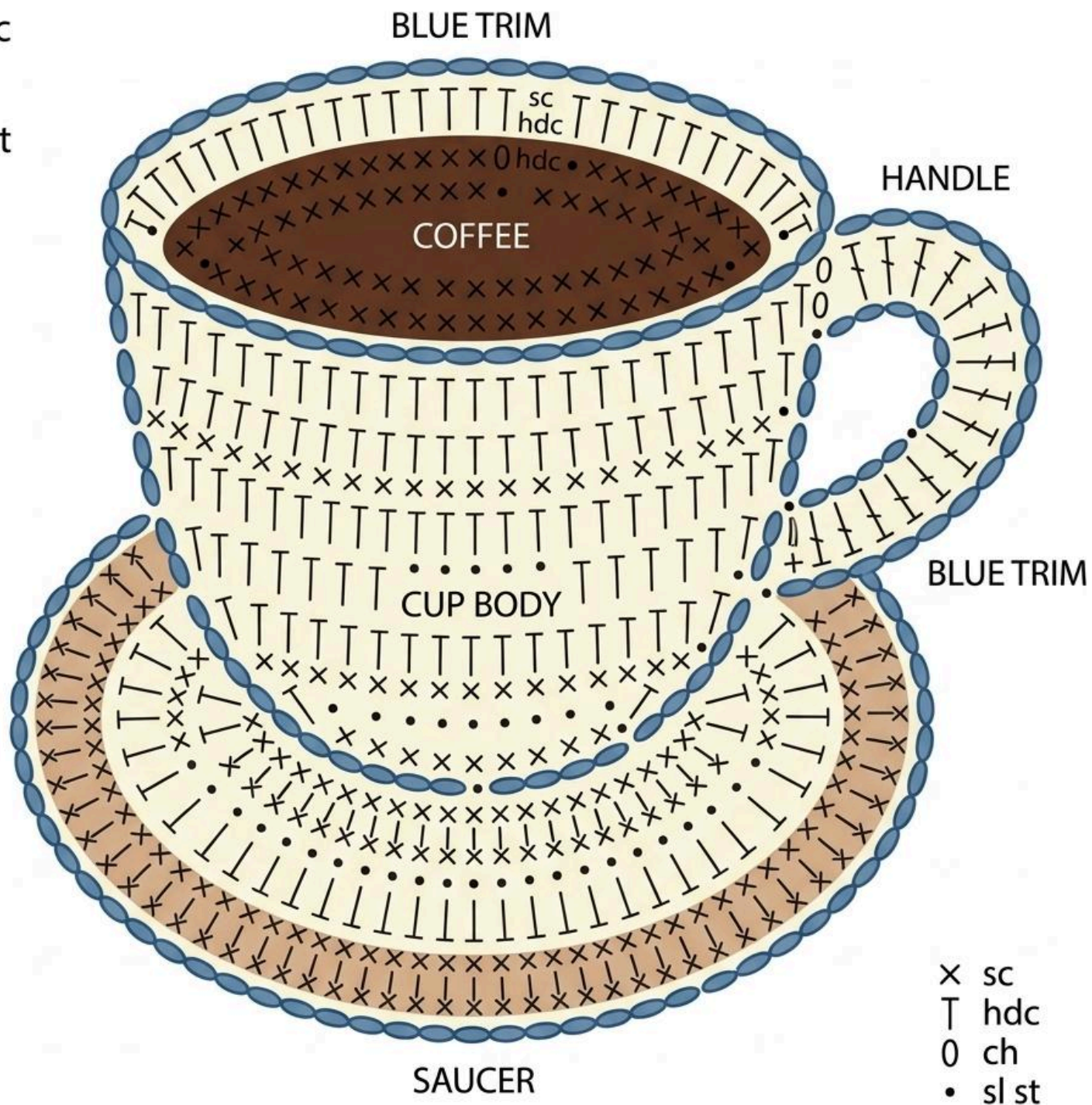
Finished measurements may vary depending on yarn weight, hook size, and personal tension.

Materials

- Worsted Weight (#4) cotton yarn
- Cream or White (Cup)
- Brown (Coffee)
- Tan or Light Beige (Saucer)
- Blue (Decorative Trim)
- 4.0 mm (G/6) crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Stitch marker (optional)

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Abbreviations (US Terms)

- ch – chain
- sc – single crochet
- hdc – half double crochet
- sl st – slip stitch
- st(s) – stitch(es)
- BLO – back loop only
- rep – repeat
- rnd – round

Before You Begin

The project is worked in four separate pieces:

- Coffee
- Cup Body
- Handle
- Saucer

After all pieces are completed, a decorative blue edging is added before assembling everything together.

Work in continuous rounds unless otherwise instructed.

Use a stitch marker to mark the first stitch of every round.

Read through the entire pattern before beginning.

Maintain consistent tension for the best results.

How to Read the Crochet Chart

The chart uses standard crochet symbols.

× = Single Crochet (sc)

Used for:

- Coffee
- Saucer
- Decorative shaping

T = Half Double Crochet (hdc)

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Used for:

- Cup body
- Handle
- Blue edging

O = Chain (ch)

Used for:

- Magic ring beginning
- Handle foundation

• = Slip Stitch (sl st)

Used for:

- Joining
- Finishing rounds
- Attaching yarn

Follow each section independently before moving to the next.

Step 1 – Crochet the Coffee

Using **brown yarn**.

Round 1

Create a magic ring.

Work **6 sc** into the ring.

Pull the ring closed.

(6 sts)

Round 2

Work **2 sc in each stitch** around.

(12 sts)

Round 3

Repeat:

1 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

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(18 sts)

Round 4

Repeat:

2 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(24 sts)

Round 5

Repeat:

3 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(30 sts)

Round 6

Repeat:

4 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(36 sts)

Round 7

Repeat:

5 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(42 sts)

Round 8

Repeat:

6 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

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(48 sts)

Round 9

Repeat:

7 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(54 sts)

Round 10

Repeat:

8 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(60 sts)

Fasten off.

The coffee should form a smooth oval-like circle that fits inside the cup opening.

Step 2 – Crochet the Cup Body

Using **cream or white yarn**.

Join the yarn to any stitch along the outside edge of the completed coffee section.

Round 1

Work **60 hdc in BLO** around.

(60 sts)

Working in the back loops creates the raised edge between the coffee and the inside wall of the cup.

Round 2

Work **1 hdc in each stitch** around.

(60 sts)

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Round 3

Repeat:

9 hdc, 2 hdc in next stitch

around.

(66 sts)

Round 4

Repeat:

10 hdc, 2 hdc in next stitch

around.

(72 sts)

Round 5

Repeat:

11 hdc, 2 hdc in next stitch

around.

(78 sts)

Round 6

Repeat:

12 hdc, 2 hdc in next stitch

around.

(84 sts)

The cup gradually widens as shown in the chart.

Rounds 7–9

Work **84 hdc** evenly around.

No increases.

This creates the straight sides of the mug.

Fasten off.

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Step 3 – Crochet the Handle

Using **cream yarn**.

Attach the yarn to one side of the cup where shown in the chart.

Chain **14**.

Row 1

Skip the first 2 chains from the hook.

Work **12 sc**.

Slip stitch into the cup.

Turn.

Row 2

Chain 1.

Work **12 sc** across.

Slip stitch into the cup again.

Fasten off.

Position both ends of the handle securely and sew them in place using matching yarn.

The handle should curve naturally away from the mug.

Step 4 – Crochet the Saucer

Using **tan yarn**.

Round 1

Create a magic ring.

Work **6 sc** into the ring.

(6 sts)

Round 2

Work **2 sc in each stitch** around.

(12 sts)

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Round 3

Repeat:

1 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(18 sts)

Round 4

Repeat:

2 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(24 sts)

Round 5

Repeat:

3 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(30 sts)

Change to **cream yarn**.

Round 6

Repeat:

4 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(36 sts)

Round 7

Work **36 sc**.

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Round 8

Repeat:

5 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(42 sts)

Round 9

Work **42 sc**.

Round 10

Repeat:

6 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(48 sts)

Round 11

Work **48 sc**.

Change back to **tan yarn**.

Round 12

Repeat:

7 sc, 2 sc in next stitch

around.

(54 sts)

Round 13

Work **54 sc** evenly around.

Fasten off.

The saucer should remain flat with gently rounded edges.

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Step 5 – Add the Blue Decorative Trim

Using **blue yarn**, add a finishing border around each section.

Around the Cup Rim

Join the yarn with a slip stitch.

Work **1 sc or hdc evenly around the entire rim**, following the chart.

Join with a slip stitch.

Fasten off.

Around the Handle

Attach the blue yarn.

Work evenly around both sides of the handle.

Join with a slip stitch.

Fasten off.

Around the Saucer

Attach blue yarn anywhere on the outer edge.

Work evenly around the entire saucer.

Add one extra stitch wherever necessary to keep the edge smooth.

Join with a slip stitch.

Fasten off.

The blue edging creates the clean decorative outline shown in the original design.

Step 6 – Assemble the Coaster

Place the saucer on a flat surface.

Center the cup on top of the saucer.

Using matching cream yarn, sew the bottom of the cup to the saucer.

Do not pull the stitches too tightly.

Check that the cup sits evenly in the center.

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Secure the handle if necessary.

Weave in all loose yarn ends using a yarn needle.

Trim any excess yarn.

Finishing Touches ✨

Lightly block the coaster if needed.

Shape the cup opening with your fingers.

Flatten the saucer.

Adjust the handle so it curves naturally.

Allow the coaster to dry completely before using.

Helpful Tips 💡

- Cotton yarn produces the best shape and durability.
- Keep your stitches even throughout the project.
- Use a stitch marker to avoid losing the beginning of each round.
- If the saucer begins to ripple, reduce your tension slightly.
- If the coaster curls upward, gently block it after completion.
- Weave in all ends securely, especially if the coaster will be washed frequently.

Care Instructions 🧺

- Hand wash or machine wash on a gentle cycle.
- Lay flat to dry.
- Do not bleach.
- Light steam blocking may be used to restore the coaster's shape after washing.
