

Crochet Pan Rug Pattern


US Crochet Terms – Based on the Chart

Skill Level: Intermediate

Finished Size: about **55–70 cm (22–28 in)** depending on yarn and hook size.

This fun **frying pan shaped crochet rug** is worked in **continuous rounds**, starting from the center of the pan and expanding outward. After the round base is finished, the **handle is crocheted separately from the edge** and attached seamlessly.

This rug is perfect for **kitchens, cooking lovers, or themed home decor**.



STITCH LEGEND		Stitch	
○	ch: Chain	x	sc: Single Crochet
x	dec: Decrease	T	hdc: Half Double Crochet
+	sc: Single Crochet	T	dc: Double Crochet

MR – magic ring
ch – chain
sl st – slip stitch
sc – single crochet
hdc – half double crochet
dc – double crochet
inc – increase (2 stitches in same stitch)
dec – decrease
st – stitch

Part 1 – Pan Base (Center Circle)

Start with **main color**

Round 1

MR, **8 sc** into ring.

Join with sl st. (8)

Round 2

Ch 1, **inc in each stitch** around.

(16)

Round 3

Ch 1, *1 sc, inc* repeat around.

(24)

Round 4

Ch 1, *2 sc, inc* repeat around.

(32)

Round 5

Ch 1, *3 sc, inc* repeat around.

(40)

Part 2 – Expanding the Pan

Round 6

Ch 1, *4 sc, inc* repeat around. (48)

Round 7

Ch 1, *5 sc, inc* repeat around. (56)

Round 8

Ch 1, sc around.

Round 9

Ch 1, 6 sc, *inc* repeat around.

Round 10

Sc around evenly.

Continue increasing until the circle measures **about 40–45 cm**.

Part 3 – Shaping the Pan Edge

To create the slightly flattened top where the handle begins:

Row 1

Work **sc across 25 stitches only**.

Turn.

Row 2

Ch 1, sc across.

Repeat for **3–4 rows**.

This forms the **flat rim area** where the handle attaches.

Part 4 – Handle Base

Attach yarn at the center of the flattened edge.

Row 1

Ch 12.

Starting in 2nd chain from hook:

Sc across chain. (11)

Row 2

Turn, ch 1.

Sc across.

Repeat for **12–16 rows** depending on handle length.

Part 5 – Handle Edge

To make the handle stronger:

Work **sc around entire handle**.

At corners:

Work **2 sc in one stitch**.

Join with sl st.

Optional Hanging Loop

At the end of the handle:

Ch 8

Sl st into handle to form a loop.

This allows the rug to **hang like a real frying pan**.

Optional Pan Rim

Attach a lighter yarn color.

Round

Work **sl st around the entire circular edge**.

This creates a subtle **metal pan rim effect**.

Finishing

- Weave in all yarn ends
 - Steam block lightly if needed
 - Make sure rug lies flat
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Size Adjustments

To make a **larger pan rug**:

- Continue circle increases for 2–3 more rounds.

To make a **smaller version**:

- Stop increasing earlier.
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Tips

- T-shirt yarn creates a **thick, sturdy kitchen rug**.
- Use darker yarn to **hide stains easily**.
- Add a **non-slip backing** if using on tile floors.
