


Crochet Skeleton Wall Organizer – Full Step-by-Step Tutorial

This detailed guide will walk you through how to create a crochet skeleton wall organizer from start to finish. It follows the structure and methods shown in the reference graphic, using standard US crochet terminology so anyone in the U.S. can follow along comfortably.

1 MATERIALS & TOOLS

- Thick chunky yarn**
(US Super Bulky size 6)
- Bone color
- Fine black yarn**
(for eye socket lining)
- Crochet Hooks:**
N-15 (10.0mm) &
H-8 (5.0mm)
- Poly-fill stuffing**
- Tapestry Needle**
- Stiffness spray/glue**



US CROCHET STITCH LEGEND & METHODS (KEY TERMS)

- ch = Chain stitch
- sc = Single crochet
- hdc = Half double crochet
- dc = Double crochet
- inc = Increase (work 2 sc in same stitch)
- sl st = Slip stitch
- dec = Decrease (work 2 sc together)
- MR = Magic Ring (adjustable starting ring)

2 PART 1: THE SKULL (start top-down)




Step-by-step instructions:

Rnd 1: 6 sc in MR.
 Rnd 2: inc x6.
 Rnd 3: (sc, inc) x6, Rnd 2: inc x6.
 Rnd 4: (sc, inc) x6.
 Rnd 5: (sc, inc) x6, Rnd 2: inc x6.
 Rnd 6: (sc, inc) x6, Rnd 2: inc x6.
 Rnd 7: (sc, inc) x6, Rnd 3: inc x6.
 Rnd 8: 6 sc in MR.
 Rnd 9: 5 sc in MR, chans int x6.
 Rnd 10: (sc, in, MR, hake x6.
 Rnd 11: (sc, it MR, Rnd 2: inc x6.
 Rnd 12: finwa with an eye socking loor.
 Rnd 13: Making and stuffing.
 Poly-fill stuffing

Closing the bottom.
 Stuffing bottom.

*** Eye socket creation**

3 PART 2: SPINE & RIBS (creating the torso frame)

Central Spine Pattern:
 Chain specific length, work sc down chain.

Detailed Rib pattern (make pairs):


Rnd 1: ribs x6
 Rnd 2: ribs x6
 Rnd 3: ribs x5
 Rnd 4: ribs x5
 Rnd 5: ribs x5
 Rnd 6: ribs x5
 Rnd 7: ribs x3
 Rnd 8: ribs x6
 Rnd 9: ribs x5

Notes: *Proper rib positioning and spacing - crocheted to the central spine, not the planned attachment points.

4 PART 3: THE STORAGE BASKETS (make 4 and join)

Basket Pattern



5 PART 4: ASSEMBLY & FINAL DISPLAY



Make and attach the pelvic-bone piece & single-point pelvic-bone

Make and attach the single-point pelvic-bone piece



Materials & Tools

Make sure you have everything ready before starting:

- Thick chunky yarn (US Super Bulky Size 6, bone/off-white color)
- Fine black yarn (for eye socket lining)
- Crochet hooks:
 - N-15 (10.0 mm)
 - H-8 (5.0 mm)
- Poly-fill stuffing
- Tapestry needle
- Stiffening spray or fabric glue
- Scissors

Finished size will be approximately:

- Height: 26 inches (66 cm)
- Width: 14 inches (35 cm)



US Crochet Stitch Guide (Key Terms)

- ch = chain
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- sl st = slip stitch
- inc = increase (2 sc in same stitch)
- dec = decrease (2 sc together)
- MR = magic ring



Part 1: The Skull (Worked Top-Down)

Step 1: Start the Base

- Round 1: 6 sc in MR
- Round 2: inc x6 (12 stitches)
- Round 3: (sc, inc) x6 (18 stitches)
- Round 4: (sc, inc) x6
- Round 5: (sc, inc) x6
- Round 6: (sc, inc) x6
- Round 7: (sc, inc) x6
- Round 8: 6 sc in MR (forming shaping detail)

Step 2: Build the Skull Shape

- Round 9: 5 sc in MR, chain x6 (forms structure)
- Round 10: (sc, inc, NO) repeat x6 (shape expansion)
- Round 11: (sc, inc, MR) repeat x6
- Round 12: finish with an eye socket loop

Step 3: Eye Sockets 🗨️

- Use fine black yarn
- Stitch into the eye areas to create hollow sockets
- Slightly indent stuffing to enhance depth

Step 4: Shape the Face

- Form nose cavity using decreases and tension shaping
- Shape jaw and cheekbones with light stuffing adjustments

Step 5: Stuff and Close

- Fill skull with poly-fill stuffing
 - Close the bottom securely
 - Add a loop at the top for hanging

Part 2: Spine & Ribs (Torso Frame)

Step 1: Central Spine

- Chain desired length (approx. torso height)
- Work single crochet down the chain
- This becomes the backbone structure

Step 2: Rib Pattern (Make in Pairs)

Follow this sequence for rib pairs:

- Round 1: ribs x6
- Round 2: ribs x6
- Round 3: ribs x5
- Round 4: ribs x5
- Round 5: ribs x5
- Round 6: ribs x5
- Round 7: ribs x3
- Round 8: ribs x6
- Round 9: ribs x5

Step 3: Attach Ribs

- Crochet ribs individually
- Attach each rib directly onto the spine using slip stitch or sewing
- Ensure even spacing for a natural skeleton look

Step 4: Pelvic Base

- Create a rounded pelvic shape
- Attach it to the bottom of the spine
- This stabilizes the structure and supports baskets

Part 3: Storage Baskets (Make 4)

Step 1: Basket Base

- Chain 20 (initial chain)
- Join to form a round

Step 2: Build Height

- Work in rounds using sc or hdc
- Continue until desired height (about 3–4 inches)

Step 3: Repeat

- Make 4 identical baskets

Step 4: Stiffen Baskets

- Apply stiffening spray or glue
- Let dry completely to hold shape

Step 5: Join Baskets

- Use mattress stitch or whip stitch
- Attach baskets side-by-side in a row

Assembly & Final Display

Step 1: Attach Skull to Spine

- Securely sew the skull to the top of the spine

Step 2: Attach Ribcage

- Ensure ribs are evenly placed and secured
- Adjust spacing if needed

Step 3: Add Pelvic Piece

- Attach pelvic base to bottom of spine

Step 4: Attach Basket Row

- Sew baskets across the lower rib area
- Ensure strong attachment for holding items

Step 5: Final Adjustments

- Reinforce all joins
- Shape bones and baskets as needed
- Add extra stiffening if necessary



Display & Use

- Hang using the loop behind the skull
- Ideal for holding:
 - Remote controls
 - Glasses
 - Small gadgets



Tips for Success

- Keep tension consistent throughout
- Use stitch markers for rounds
- Adjust stuffing gradually for realistic shaping
- Reinforce high-stress areas like basket attachments
