

# 🌸 Complete Sewing Tutorial: Flower Pocket Organizer (with CM Measurements)

This step-by-step guide walks you through everything needed to create a beautiful and functional flower-shaped wall pocket organizer. All measurements are in centimeters (cm), and seam allowance (SA) is 1 cm unless stated otherwise.

## COMPLETE SEWING & CONSTRUCTION GUIDE: FLOWER POCKET ORGANIZER (with CM Measurements)




### 1. EXPLODED PARTS VIEW & CUTTING LIST

All seam allowances (SA) are 1.0 cm unless otherwise noted.

[1] Main Flower Base: Back [s1 Canvas], Interfacing [s1 Firm Fusible], and Padding [x1 Batting] - 40 cm dia.  
 [2] Main Flower Base: Front [x1 Canvas] - 40 cm dia.

[3] Petal: Pattern A (Front/Back/Padding) x Quantity per color - e.g., cut x16 pattern fabric, - e.g., cut x16 pattern fabric)


[4] Pocket Panel: Main Panel (x1 Canvas), Backing (x1 Linen), Interfacing (x1 Light Weight Fusible)

[5] Individual Pockets (A/B/C/D patterns) s Quantities

[6] Fabric Flower Accent [x1 per organizer]

[7] Stem [x1 per organizer] with Leaves

[8] Cord Loop for Hanging



**2. MAIN BASE CONSTRUCTION**

[A] Fuse Interfacing to Canvas Base.  
 - Stack (interfaced Base - Padding - Backing Base, - Padding - Backing Base)  
 - Baste layers.

[B] Add decorative edge stitching

Final diameter: 38 cm

### 3. PETAL PREPARATION & ASSEMBLY

[A] Fuse padding to the interfaced front layer.  
 - With right-sides together, stitch front-to-back layers, leaving top edge open. Trim corners, turn right-side out, and press.

[C] Edge for all stitching detail.

Repeat for all required petals.

Fast padding to required petals

### [D] Main Base Layering

Aware all prepared all pinned to the perimeter with equal spacing.

38 cm circumference / number of petals = x cm spacing

Edge stitching to secure petals to base.  
 - x cm stitching to secure spining to.

Outer diameter: ~48 cm

### 4. POCKET PANEL & INDIVIDUAL POCKETS

Grid Panel Width: 24 cm

B [Gingham]: W 6 cm, H 6 cm, H 8 cm, plus 1 cm hem. 1 us 56 cm plus hem, etc.

[E] Stitching individual pockets to the consolidated grid.

[E] Stitching individual pockets to the consolidated grid. Placement the bottom gussets.

A [Heart fabric]: B pockets to the B consolidated grid.  
 E] Placeen forming bottom gussets.

### 5. FINAL ASSEMBLY & DETAILS

[F] Attach consolidates grid panel to the main petal base, centering it.

[G] Crafting and attachment of the decorative fabric flower accent.

[H] Creation and attachment of the fabric Stem and (s.g., Stem: 1m long. Folded fabric technique).

[I] Securely attach the hanging Cord loop to the top.

## Materials & Tools

### Fabrics & Notions

- Canvas (main base)
- Cotton fabric (petals, pockets, accents)
- Gingham fabric (optional for pockets)
- Fusible interfacing
- Batting (approx. 40 cm diameter piece)
- Lightweight fusible backing
- Cord (for hanging loop)
- Thread (matching colors)

### Tools

- Sewing machine
- Fabric scissors
- Pins
- Iron
- Ruler or measuring tape
- Fabric marker or chalk



## Step 1: Cutting All Pieces

Cut the following pieces:

### Main Flower Base

- 1x Front (canvas) – 40 cm diameter
- 1x Backing (linen or cotton)
- 1x Padding (batting, 40 cm diameter)
- 1x Interfacing (for front)

### Petals

- Use petal pattern (approx. 12 cm tall x 10 cm wide)
- Cut multiple petals (quantity depends on spacing around circle; approx. 10–12 petals)
- Cut matching pieces for front, backing, and padding

### Pocket Panel

- 1x Main panel (canvas) – 24 cm wide x 26 cm high
- Backing layer + fusible interfacing

## Individual Pockets

- Sizes:
  - A: 6 cm width
  - B: 8 cm width
  - C: 6 cm width
  - D: 8 cm width
- Add 1 cm seam allowance and ~6 cm extra height for hems

## Extras

- 1x Fabric flower accent
- 1x Stem (approx. 18 cm visible length; cut longer for folding)
- Leaves (optional)
- Cord loop for hanging



## Step 2: Construct the Main Base

### A. Layering

1. Fuse interfacing to the wrong side of the canvas front.
2. Stack layers:
  - Front (interfaced)
  - Batting
  - Backing fabric
3. Pin or baste all layers together.

### B. Stitching

- Sew around the edge with a **straight stitch (0.2–0.3 cm length)**.
- Add a decorative topstitch near the edge for a polished look.

Final diameter after sewing: ~38 cm



## Step 3: Prepare the Petals

### A. Assemble Each Petal

1. Fuse padding to the front fabric.
2. Place front and backing **right sides together**.
3. Stitch around edges, leaving the top open.
4. Trim corners for smooth curves.
5. Turn right-side out and press.

## B. Edge Stitching

- Topstitch around each petal edge for structure and detail.

Repeat for all petals.

## Step 4: Attach Petals to Base

1. Arrange petals evenly around the circular base edge.
2. Calculate spacing:
  - Base circumference  $\approx$  38 cm
  - Divide by number of petals to space evenly
3. Pin petals in place.
4. Sew along the base edge to secure them.

## Step 5: Create the Pocket Panel

### A. Prepare Base Panel

1. Fuse interfacing to the panel.
2. Layer with backing fabric and stitch edges.

### B. Prepare Individual Pockets

1. Fold top edge of each pocket piece (about 1 cm twice) and stitch hem.
2. Optional: Add decorative stitching.

### C. Assemble Grid

1. Arrange pockets into a grid (as shown: A, B, C, D layout).
2. Stitch vertical seams first to join columns.
3. Then stitch horizontal seams to form rows.

### D. Add Gussets (Optional)

- Slightly fold bottom corners of pockets to create depth.
- Stitch in place.

## Step 6: Attach Pockets to Panel

1. Place completed pockets onto the panel.
2. Stitch along sides and bottoms.
3. Reinforce corners for durability.

## Step 7: Final Assembly

### A. Attach Pocket Panel to Flower Base

1. Center the pocket panel on the flower base.
2. Pin securely.
3. Stitch around the panel edges.

### B. Add Stem and Leaves

1. Fold fabric strip lengthwise for stem.
2. Stitch and turn.
3. Attach to bottom center of flower.
4. Add leaves if desired.

### C. Create Fabric Flower Accent

1. Roll and shape fabric into a flower.
2. Stitch to secure shape.
3. Attach to the top of the pocket panel.

### D. Add Hanging Loop

1. Fold cord into a loop.
2. Insert at top back of flower.
3. Stitch securely.

## Stitch Guide (Recommended Settings)

- Straight stitch: 0.2–0.3 cm → general seams
- Topstitch: 0.35 cm → edges and decorative finishing
