

CROCHET DAISY BRACELET PATTERN

🌻 Overview of the Bracelet

This bracelet is made in three main parts:

- A braided/twisted cord base
- 4 daisy crochet motifs
- Chain connections (CH 4) between each daisy
- A twisted adjustable closure

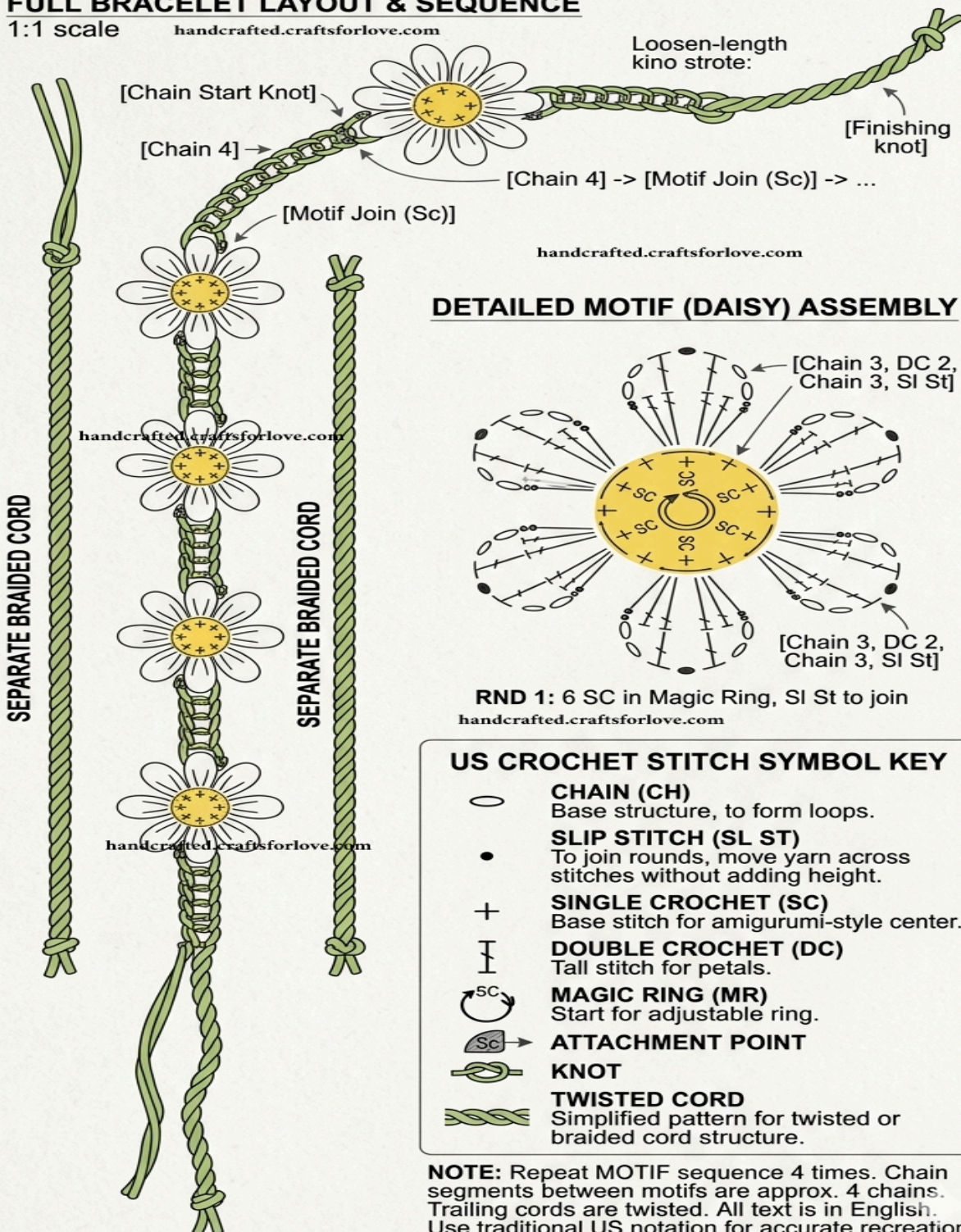
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Everything is worked in **US crochet terms**, exactly like the diagram.

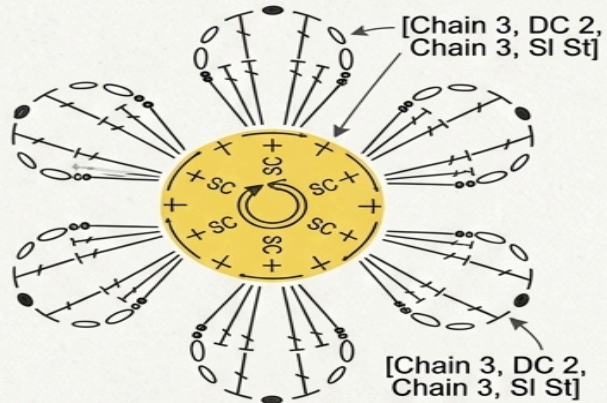
FULL BRACELET LAYOUT & SEQUENCE

1:1 scale

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DETAILED MOTIF (DAISY) ASSEMBLY



RND 1: 6 SC in Magic Ring, Sl St to join

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US CROCHET STITCH SYMBOL KEY

- **CHAIN (CH)**
Base structure, to form loops.
- **SLIP STITCH (SL ST)**
To join rounds, move yarn across stitches without adding height.
- + **SINGLE CROCHET (SC)**
Base stitch for amigurumi-style center.
- ⌈ **DOUBLE CROCHET (DC)**
Tall stitch for petals.
- ⤷ **MAGIC RING (MR)**
Start for adjustable ring.
- ⤷ **ATTACHMENT POINT**
- 🪄 **KNOT**
- 🪄 **TWISTED CORD**
Simplified pattern for twisted or braided cord structure.

NOTE: Repeat MOTIF sequence 4 times. Chain segments between motifs are approx. 4 chains. Trailing cords are twisted. All text is in English. Use traditional US notation for accurate recreation.



Materials (Exact Recommendations)

- Yarn: Cotton yarn (size 3 or 4 works best)
- Hook: 3.5 mm (E) or 4.0 mm (G)
- Scissors <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> **SEE THE BEST PATTERNS**
- Tapestry needle (optional)
- Tape or clip (to hold your cord steady)



Crochet Terms You MUST Know

Before starting, understand these:

- **CH (Chain)**: Yarn over, pull through loop
- **SL ST (Slip Stitch)**: Insert hook, yarn over, pull through everything
- **SC (Single Crochet)**: Insert hook, yarn over, pull up loop, yarn over, pull through both
- **DC (Double Crochet)**: Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over, pull up loop, yarn over pull through 2, yarn over pull through 2
- **MR (Magic Ring)**: Adjustable loop used for circles



Step 1: Make the Base Cord (VERY IMPORTANT)

This is NOT crocheted — it is **twisted or braided**.

1. Cut **3–6 strands of yarn**, each about **60–75 cm (24–30 inches)** long
2. Hold strands together
3. Tie a knot at one end (this is your **starting knot**)
4. Twist tightly OR braid the strands
5. Tie another temporary knot at the other end to keep it from unraveling

👉 This cord is where your daisies will be attached.



Step 2: Secure Your Work

Tape or clip the cord to a table so it stays still while you crochet.

This makes everything MUCH easier.



Step 3: Crochet the First Daisy (CENTER FIRST)

You will now make your first flower.

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3.1 Make the Center

1. Make a **Magic Ring (MR)**
2. Work **6 SC** into the ring
3. Pull the ring tight
4. Join with **SL ST** into the first SC

✓ You now have a small circle — this is the flower center.

3.2 Make the Petals (Repeat Around)

Each petal =

CH 3 → 2 DC → CH 3 → SL ST (into the same center)

Step-by-step for ONE petal:

1. CH 3
2. Yarn over, make 2 DC into the center
3. CH 3
4. SL ST back into the center

Repeat this around the circle (usually 5–6 petals depending on spacing).

✓ You now have a complete daisy 🌻

Step 4: Attach Daisy to the Cord

This is called **Motif Join (SL ST)** in your diagram.

1. Place the daisy on top of the cord
2. Insert hook through the back of the flower and under the cord
3. Yarn over and pull through
4. Make a **SL ST to secure it**

👉 The flower should now be anchored to the cord.

Step 5: Create the First Chain Segment

- CH 4 <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> **SEE THE BEST PATTERNS**

Keep the chain running along the cord.

👉 This spacing is exactly what your diagram shows.

Step 6: Make the Second Daisy

Repeat EXACTLY Step 3:

- MR
- 6 SC
- SL ST join
- Petals: (CH 3, 2 DC, CH 3, SL ST) around

Then: <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> SEE THE BEST PATTERNS

Attach it

- Use SL ST to join it to the cord, right after your CH 4

Step 7: Repeat the Pattern

Continue this exact sequence:

- CH 4
- Make daisy
- Attach with SL ST

Do this until you have **4 daisies total**

👉 Your sequence should look like:

Daisy → CH 4 → Daisy → CH 4 → Daisy → CH 4 → Daisy

Step 8: Extend the Cord (Other Side)

After the last daisy:

1. Continue the cord by twisting or braiding more yarn
2. Match the length of the starting side

✓ Now your bracelet has two ends.

Step 9: Create the Adjustable Closure

From the diagram, the ends are twisted cords with knots.

Option 1 (Simple Knots)

- Tie a knot at each end

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Option 2 (Better – Adjustable)

1. Overlap both cords
2. Tie a sliding knot around both strands
3. Tighten to adjust size

Step 10: Clean Finish

- Trim loose yarn
- Pull all knots tight
- Use a needle to hide ends if needed

Final Structure Check

Your bracelet should have:

- ✓ 4 daisy motifs
- ✓ CH 4 between each
- ✓ All daisies attached with SL ST
- ✓ Twisted cords on both sides
- ✓ Knots at ends <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> SEE THE BEST PATTERNS

Pro Tips (Very Helpful)

- Keep your tension even → prevents uneven petals
- Always tighten your Magic Ring fully
- If petals curl, loosen your DC stitches slightly
- If daisies move, tighten your SL ST attachment

You're Done!
