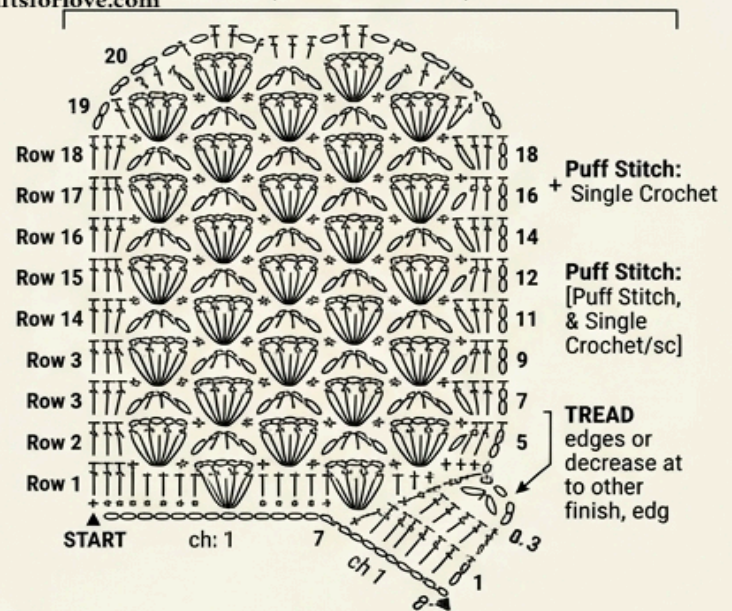
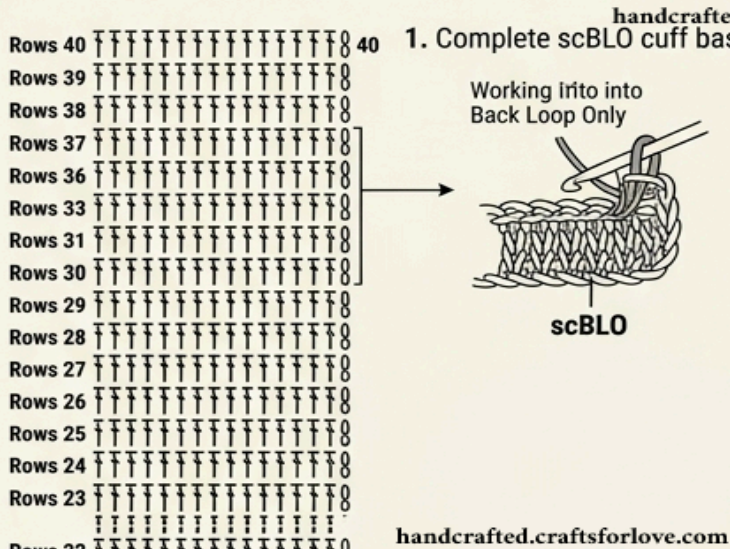


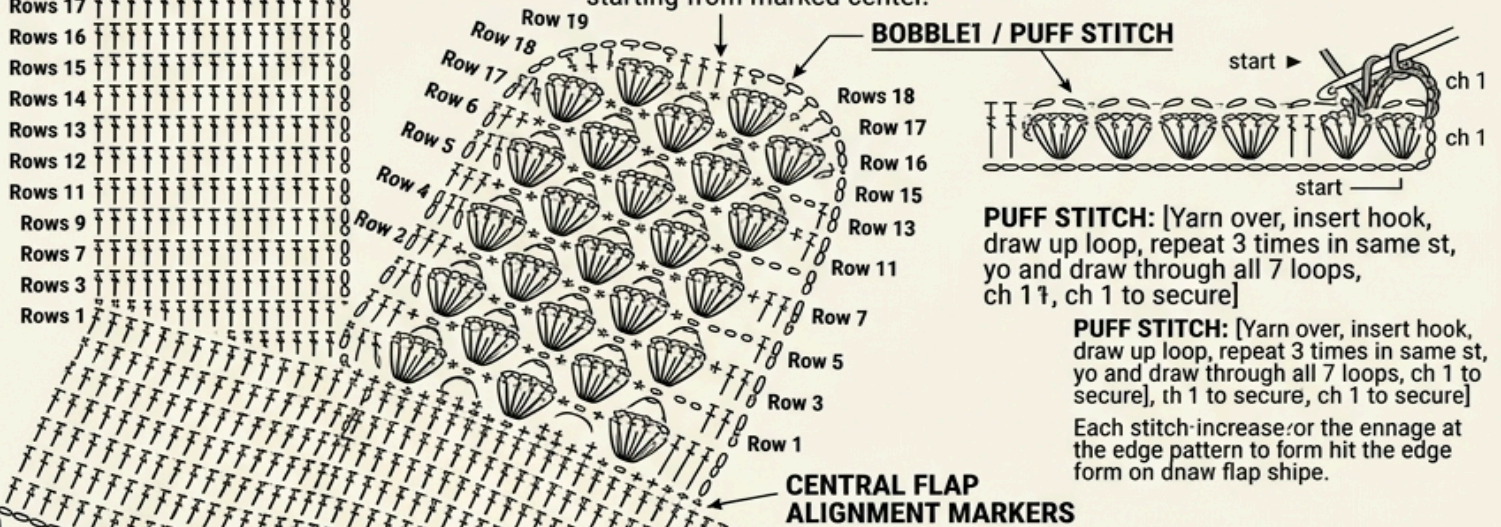
Crochet Booties Pattern

FLAT CUFF AND HEEL BASE PATTERN (scBLO)

TEXTURED UPPER-FOOT FLAP PATTERN (Puff Stitch/sc)



2. Work Puff Stitch flap starting from marked center.



PUFF STITCH: [Yarn over, insert hook, draw up loop, repeat 3 times in same st, yo and draw through all 7 loops, ch 1 to secure]

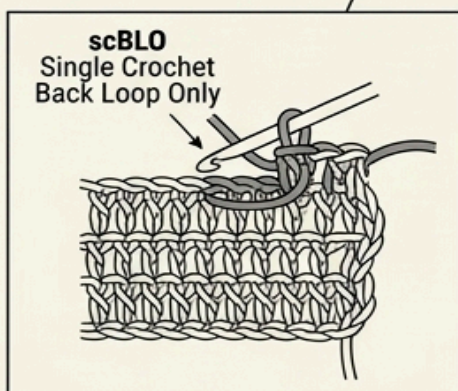
PUFF STITCH: [Yarn over, insert hook, draw up loop, repeat 3 times in same st, yo and draw through all 7 loops, ch 1 to secure, th 1 to secure, ch 1 to secure]

Each stitch-increase or the enrage at the edge pattern to form hit the edge form on draw flap shape.

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1. Complete scBLO cuff base.

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MATERIALS NEEDED:
Dark Gray Worsted Wool,
Size 5mm Hook (U.S. H/8)

ASSEMBLY PREP:
Stitch markers recommended

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3. Mark points for final assembly (e.g., heel seam, side attachment)

CROCHET STITCH LEGEND

- ch Chain
- sl st Slip Stitch
- sc Single Crochet
- scBLO Single Crochet Back Loop Only
- Puff st. Puff Stitch [Yarn over, insert hook, draw up loop, repeat 3 times in same st, yo and draw through all 7 loops, ch 1 to secure]

Flat Cuff and Heel Base (scBLO)

Start by creating the foundation for your slipper.

- ch = chain
- sc = single crochet
- scBLO = single crochet in back loop only

Step 1: Foundation Chain

- Begin with a foundation chain (length according to your desired size; the chart shows a long base to wrap the foot).
- Turn your work.

Step 2: Row 1 (Single Crochet)

- Work 1 sc into each chain across.
- Chain 1, turn.

Step 3: Build the Cuff Base (Rows 2–40)

- From now on, work **scBLO (single crochet in back loop only)** across each row.
- Chain 1 and turn at the end of every row.
- Continue this for **approximately 40 rows**, or until the piece comfortably wraps around the foot (this forms the cuff and heel base).

👉 Tip: Working in the back loop only creates a ribbed texture that gives stretch and structure. <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> **SEE THE BEST PATTERNS**



Understanding scBLO

- Insert your hook into **only the back loop** of each stitch (the loop furthest from you).
- Complete your single crochet as usual.

This technique creates the ribbed cuff look shown in the diagram.



Textured Upper-Foot Flap (Puff Stitch Pattern)

This section forms the decorative top of the slipper.

Step 4: Locate the Center

- Fold your cuff base slightly to find the **center top edge**.
- Mark this point with a stitch marker.

Step 5: Begin the Flap

- Attach yarn at the marked center.
- Chain 1.

Step 6: Row 1 (Base Row)

- Work sc evenly across the marked section (this will be the width of the flap).
- Turn.

Step 7: Puff Stitch Rows (Rows 2–18)

You will now follow the puff stitch pattern shown in the chart.

Puff Stitch (Bobble):

- Yarn over, insert hook into stitch, pull up a loop
- Repeat 3 times in the same stitch (you will have 7 loops on hook)
- Yarn over, pull through all loops
- Chain 1 to secure

👉 Some rows combine **puff stitches and single crochet**.

- Alternate rows of puff stitches and sc as indicated.
- Each row slightly increases at the edges to create the curved “flap” shape.
- Continue building rows up to approximately **Row 18–20**, forming a rounded top.

Step 8: Shaping the Flap

- At the edges, follow the chart’s increases (adding stitches) to widen the flap.
- This shaping ensures the flap covers the top of the foot comfortably.

Step 9: Final Row of Flap

- Finish with a row that stabilizes the edge (usually sc).
- Fasten off.



Tread and Edge Notes

- The chart indicates **edge adjustments** to match the sole.
- If needed, decrease slightly along edges so the flap aligns with the base.
- The goal is a smooth curve that fits naturally over the foot.

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Assembly Preparation

Step 10: Mark Key Points

Use stitch markers to identify:

- Heel seam
- Side edges
- Toe alignment (center of flap)

This ensures everything lines up correctly.

Final Assembly

Step 11: Form the Slipper Shape

- Fold the base so the short edges meet at the heel.
- Sew or slip stitch the heel seam closed.

Step 12: Attach the Flap

- Position the puff stitch flap over the top of the foot.
- Align it with the center and sides.
- Sew or crochet it onto the base along the edges.

Step 13: Finish Edges

- Optionally add a round of slip stitches or single crochet around the opening for a clean finish.

Materials Needed

- Worsted weight yarn (example: dark gray wool)
- 5 mm crochet hook (U.S. H/8)
- Stitch markers (recommended)
- Yarn needle for sewing

Tips for Sizing

- Adjust the number of rows in the cuff base for foot circumference.
- Adjust flap width by working more or fewer stitches at the center.
- Always test fit as you go.

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Final Notes

- The ribbed cuff gives stretch and comfort.
- The puff stitch adds texture and thickness to the top.
- Take your time with shaping—it's what makes the slipper fit well.

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
