

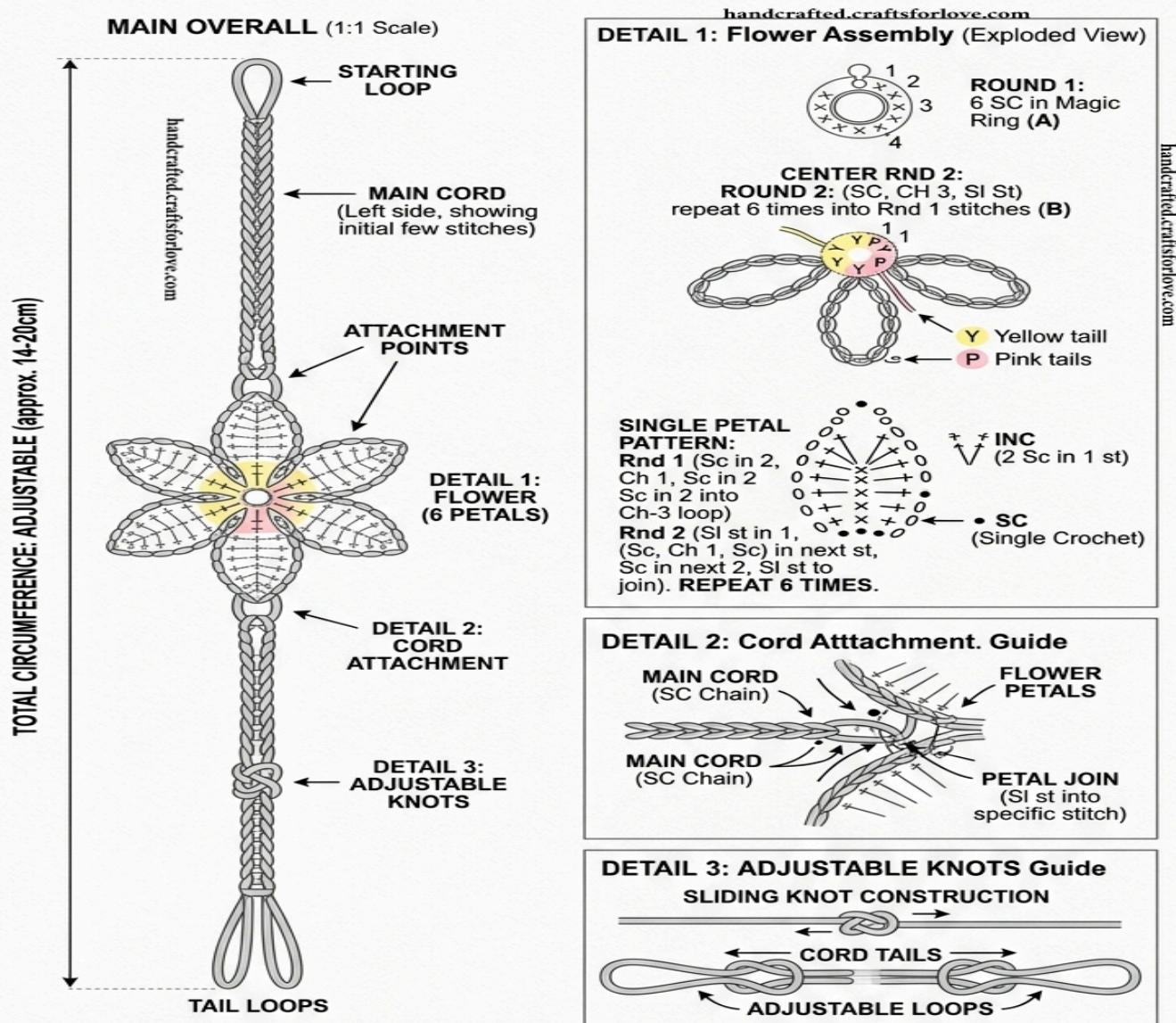
# Crochet Lily Bracelet Pattern

## Materials & Preparation

Before starting, gather:

- Cotton yarn (2–3 colors: main cord + flower center + petals)
- Crochet hook (size appropriate for your yarn, usually 2.5–4 mm)
- Scissors
- Yarn needle (for weaving ends)

This project creates an **adjustable bracelet/necklace cord with a 6-petal flower centerpiece**. <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> **SEE THE BEST PATTERNS**



### SYMBOL KEY (Traditional US Crochet)

	<b>MAGIC RING (MR)</b> Adjustable center, standard starting technique.		<b>SINGLE CROCHET (SC)</b> Fundamental tight stitch for center and petal edge.
	<b>CHAIN (CH)</b> Standard chain stitch for distance and texture.		<b>INCREASE (INC)</b> Adding stitches to expand form.
	<b>SLIP STITCH (SL ST)</b> To join rounds, move across stitches without height.		<b>DECREASE (DEC)</b> To taper shapes.
	<b>SINGLE CROCHET (SC)</b> Fundamental tight stitch for center and petal edge.		<b>ATTACHMENT / JOIN</b>
			<b>KNOT</b>

## Step 1: Create the Starting Loop

1. Begin by making a **simple loop (starting loop)**.
2. Pull yarn through to secure it loosely.
3. This loop will become the top of your adjustable cord.

👉 Tip: Keep it slightly loose so you can work stitches comfortably.

## Step 2: Crochet the Main Cord

1. Chain (CH) repeatedly to form a long cord.
2. Continue chaining until your cord reaches approximately:
  - **14–20 cm (adjustable length)**
3. Turn and work **single crochet (SC)** stitches back along the chain if you want a thicker, braided look (as shown in the diagram).

👉 This creates the **main cord** where the flower will attach.

## Step 3: Make the Flower Center (Magic Ring)

1. Create a **Magic Ring (MR)**.
2. Round 1: Work **6 single crochet (SC)** into the ring.
3. Pull the ring tight to close.

Now you have a small circular center.

## Step 4: Build the Flower Base (Round 2)

1. Into each stitch from Round 1, repeat:
  - (SC, CH 3, Slip Stitch)
2. Do this **6 times total**.

👉 You now have **6 chain loops** radiating outward. These loops will become the petals.

## Step 5: Crochet One Petal

Work into one chain loop:

Round 1 inside loop: <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> **SEE THE BEST PATTERNS**

- SC in 2 stitches
- CH 1
- SC in next 2 stitches
- (You are shaping the petal)

Round 2: <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> SEE THE BEST PATTERNS

- Slip stitch into first stitch
- (SC, CH 1, SC) in next stitch
- SC in next 2 stitches
- Slip stitch to join

👉 This forms one petal shape.

## Step 6: Repeat Petals

Repeat Step 5 for all 6 loops.

You will now have a complete **6-petal flower** 

## Step 7: Attach the Flower to the Cord

1. Position the flower at the center of your cord.
2. Use slip stitches (SL ST) to attach:
  - Join through specific stitches at the base of petals
  - Anchor securely to the cord

👉 Make sure the flower sits flat and centered.

## Step 8: Create the Bottom Cord

1. Continue crocheting a second cord from the bottom of the flower:
  - Chain to match the length of the first cord
2. Optionally reinforce with single crochet for strength

## Step 9: Make Adjustable Sliding Knots

1. Cross both cord ends over each other.
2. Take one cord tail and wrap it around the opposite cord 2–3 times.
3. Pull the end through the loops to form a **sliding knot**.
4. Repeat on the other side.

👉 This creates an **adjustable closure system**.

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## Step 10: Add Tail Loops

1. At each end of the cord:
  - Fold yarn to form a small loop
  - Secure with knots

These are your **tail loops** for decoration and function.



## Step 11: Finishing

- Tighten all knots
- Weave in loose ends with a yarn needle
- Trim excess yarn



## Stitch Reference (US Terms)

- MR = Magic Ring
- CH = Chain
- SC = Single Crochet
- SL ST = Slip Stitch
- INC = 2 SC in one stitch
- DEC = decrease (used for shaping)
