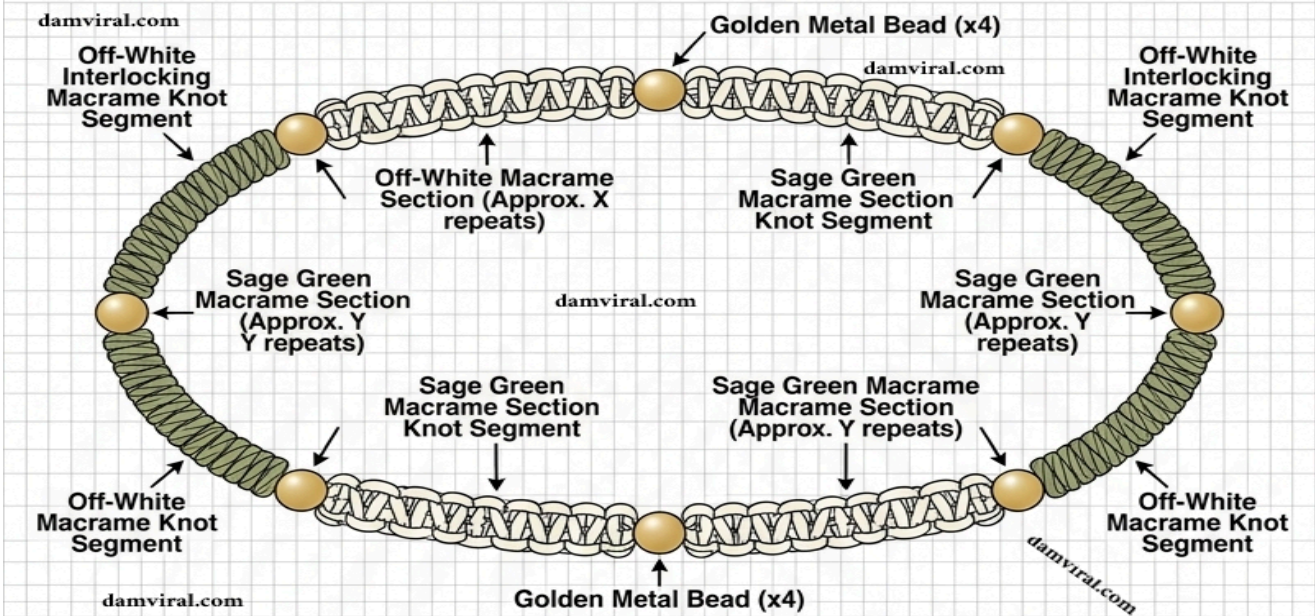

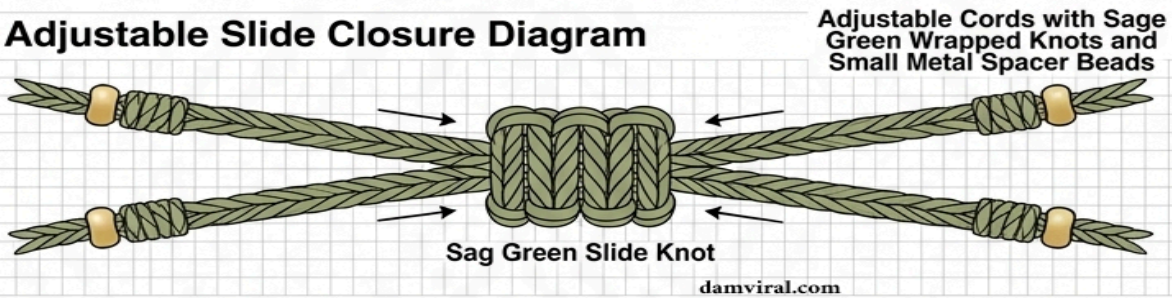
Crochet Daisy & Leaf Friendship Bracelet Tutorial 🌻 🌿

A complete step-by-step US crochet and macramé pattern tutorial based on the diagram

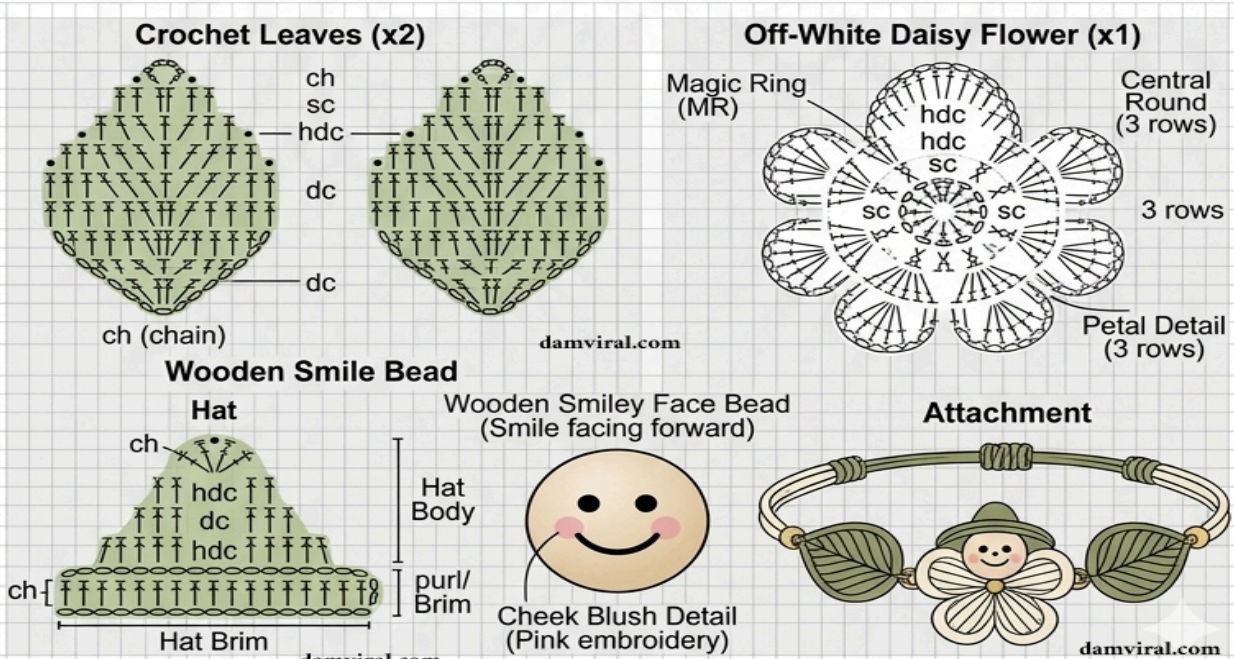
1. Main Bracelet Loop Construction Diagram

This detailed tutorial teaches you how to create a beautiful adjustable bracelet featuring:

- Sage green macramé bracelet sections
- Off-white interlocking crochet bands
- Golden spacer beads
- Crochet leaves
- A layered daisy flower centerpiece
- A tiny wooden smile bead character with a crochet hat
- Adjustable sliding closure

The instructions below closely follow the diagram while expanding every step so beginners and intermediate crocheters in the United States can complete the bracelet successfully from start to finish.

Skill Level

Intermediate Beginner

You should already know:

- chain stitch
- single crochet
- half double crochet
- double crochet
- slip stitch
- simple knotting and braiding

Materials Needed

Yarn & Cord

- Sage green crochet cotton or nylon cord
- Off-white crochet cotton
- Light beige yarn (optional flower center details)

Beads

- 4 golden metal spacer beads
- 1 wooden smiley face bead
- 4 small metal spacer beads for closure ends

Tools

- 2.0 mm–3.0 mm crochet hook
- Scissors
- Tapestry needle
- Measuring tape
- Clipboard or macramé board (optional)

US Crochet Abbreviations

- ch = chain
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- sl st = slip stitch
- MR = magic ring
- rep = repeat

Finished Bracelet Structure Overview

The bracelet consists of:

1. Two off-white interlocking crochet sections
2. Four sage green macramé knot sections
3. Four golden spacer beads
4. Two crochet leaves
5. One layered daisy flower
6. One wooden smile bead character
7. Adjustable sliding closure cords

The bracelet is symmetrical and designed to look balanced on both sides.

Step 1 — Measure and Prepare Your Cord

Cut the following:

Sage Green Cord

- 2 cords approximately 40–50 inches long for the bracelet base
- 1 additional cord for wrapping knots and slide closure

Off-White Yarn

- Enough for two crochet bracelet sections
- Additional yarn for flower petals

Important Tip

It is always better to cut extra cord than too little.

Macramé knots consume more cord than most beginners expect.

Step 2 — Create the Off-White Interlocking Crochet Bracelet Sections

These are the decorative crochet sections shown at the top and bottom of the bracelet diagram.

Foundation Chain

Using off-white yarn:

- Chain enough stitches to create the desired bracelet curve.
- The diagram labels this as:

“Off-White Macrame Section (Approx. X repeats)”

A good beginner starting point is:

- chain 18–24

Row 1

Work:

- 1 single crochet into each chain

Turn your work.

Row 2

Create the interlocking appearance by alternating:

- chain stitches
- slip stitches
- single crochet stitches

Maintain a woven appearance similar to the chart.

Repeat Pattern

Continue repeating the pattern rows until the section reaches the desired width and firmness.

Make:

- 2 matching sections

These sections will sit opposite each other on the bracelet.

Step 3 — Add the Golden Metal Beads ✨

The diagram includes:

“Golden Metal Bead (x4)”

Slide one bead onto each end of the crochet sections.

Positioning:

- One bead between each crochet and macramé segment

Secure temporarily with knots so they stay in place.

Step 4 — Make the Sage Green Macramé Sections 🌿

These curved green sections connect the bracelet together.

The chart labels them:

“Sage Green Macrame Section (Approx. Y repeats)”

Setting Up

Attach sage green cords beside the beads.

Basic Knot Pattern

Use repeated half knots or square knots.

For each section:

1. Anchor cords securely
2. Tie consistent repeating knots
3. Pull evenly for a smooth spiral texture

Continue until each side matches the diagram length.

Important Consistency Tip

Keep:

- knot spacing equal
- tension even
- both sides symmetrical

You will create:

- four sage green curved knot sections total

Step 5 — Connect Bracelet Sections

Arrange all components in this order:

- Crochet section
- Gold bead
- Green macramé section
- Gold bead
- Crochet section

Mirror the same arrangement on the opposite side.

Tie securely using hidden joining knots.

Weave in loose ends carefully.

Step 6 — Crochet the Daisy Flower

The flower is the main centerpiece.

The chart labels:

- “Magic Ring (MR)”
- “Central Round”
- “Petal Detail”

Round 1 — Center Ring

Using off-white yarn:

Create a magic ring.

Work:

- 8 sc into the ring

Join with sl st.

Round 2 — Petal Bases

Chain 2.

In each stitch:

- work dc stitches
- separate petals with chain spaces

You should begin seeing petal divisions.

Round 3 — Build Petals

Into each petal space:

Work:

- dc
- hdc
- dc combinations

The petals should curve outward softly.

Round 4 — Petal Edging

Add outer shaping using:

- sc
- sl st
- chain stitches

This gives the flower rounded edges like the diagram.

Fasten off and weave ends neatly.

Step 7 — Crochet the Leaves

The bracelet uses:

“Crochet Leaves (x2)”

Make two identical leaves using sage green yarn.

Leaf Foundation

Chain approximately 10 stitches.

Side 1

Work along one side of the chain:

- sc
- hdc
- dc
- tr stitches near center
- then decrease symmetrically

Leaf Tip

At the top:

- chain 2 or 3
- slip stitch back

This creates the pointed tip.

Side 2

Work down the opposite side of the chain mirror-style.

Slip stitch to close.

Fasten off.

Repeat for second leaf.

Step 8 — Make the Tiny Crochet Hat 🎩

This tiny hat sits on top of the smile bead.

The chart labels:

- “Wooden Smile Bead Hat”

Use sage green yarn.

Hat Top

Create a magic ring.

Work:

- hdc stitches into ring

Increase gradually each round.

Hat Body

Continue hdc rounds without increasing.

This forms the cone shape.

Hat Brim

At the final round:

- work wider dc stitches
- add chain spaces if desired

The brim should flare outward slightly.

Fasten off.

Step 9 — Prepare the Wooden Smiley Bead 😊

Take the wooden smile bead.

The diagram notes:

- smile facing forward
- pink cheek embroidery optional

Optional Blush Detail

Using pink embroidery thread:

Add tiny blush stitches under each eye.

Keep details subtle.

Step 10 — Assemble the Character Centerpiece

Now combine:

- flower
- smile bead
- tiny hat

Assembly Order

1. Sew flower to bracelet center
2. Attach smile bead at flower center
3. Sew tiny crochet hat above bead

Make sure:

- the face remains centered
- petals stay visible
- leaves angle outward evenly

Step 11 — Attach the Crochet Leaves

Sew one leaf on each side of the flower.

Position them slightly angled outward like the diagram.

Secure tightly using matching thread.

Step 12 — Create the Adjustable Sliding Closure

The chart labels this:

“Adjustable Slide Closure Diagram”

This closure allows the bracelet to fit many wrist sizes.

Overlap Bracelet Ends

Cross both bracelet cords over one another.

Attach New Working Cord

Using sage green cord:

Tie around both center cords.

Slide Knot Pattern

Work repeated square knots around the overlapping cords.

Continue until:

- the slide section is about 1 inch long

Tie off securely.

Trim excess carefully.

Step 13 — Finish the Closure Ends

The diagram shows:

“Adjustable Cords with Sage Green Wrapped Knots and Small Metal Spacer Beads”

End Finishing

On each loose cord end:

1. Slide on small spacer bead
2. Tie stopper knot
3. Wrap with sage green cord

Trim excess neatly.

Step 14 — Final Inspection ✨

Check the bracelet carefully.

Make sure:

- knots are secure
- petals are symmetrical
- leaves match
- beads do not slide unintentionally
- closure moves smoothly

Weave in every loose end.

Finished Bracelet 🌿🌻

Your bracelet now includes:

- textured crochet bands
- elegant macramé sections
- gold accent beads
- handmade crochet leaves
- layered daisy flower centerpiece
- tiny smiling woodland-style character
- adjustable professional closure

The final result combines:

- crochet
- jewelry making

Helpful Beginner Tips

- Count stitches every round
- Keep knot tension consistent
- Use stitch markers for petals
- Make leaves identical before attaching
- Test closure movement before trimming cords

Customization Ideas

You can personalize this bracelet by:

- changing flower colors
- adding pearl beads
- using pastel yarns
- making sunflower versions
- adding tiny charms
- using metallic crochet thread
- replacing the smile bead with initials or gemstones

Care Instructions

- Hand wash gently only
- Avoid soaking wooden beads
- Dry flat
- Store away from moisture
- Do not pull closure cords aggressively

Finished Size

Adjustable to fit most wrists thanks to the sliding knot closure.
