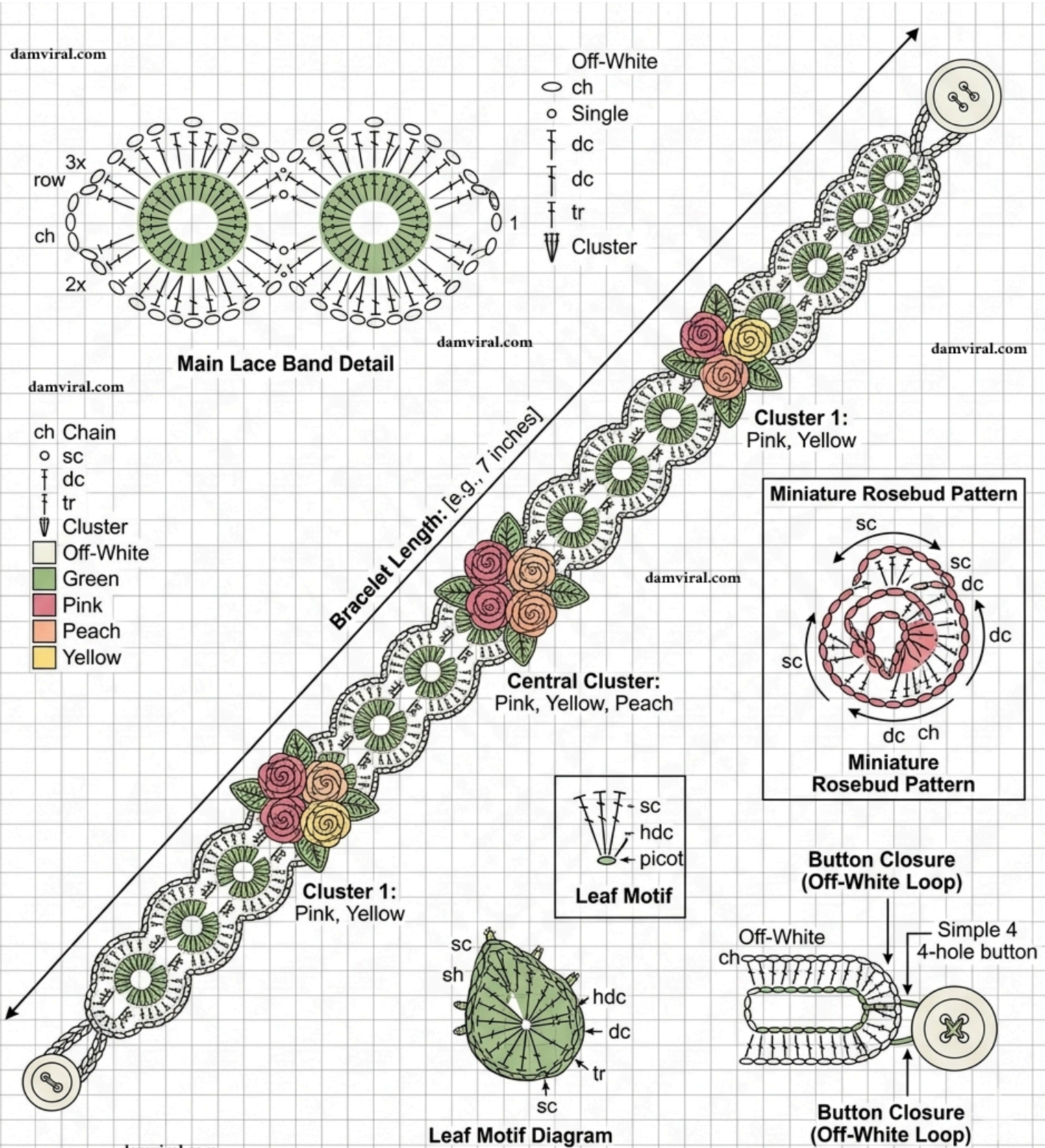


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# Crochet Rose Lace Bracelet Tutorial

Create a delicate vintage-inspired crochet bracelet featuring circular lace motifs, tiny rosebuds, leafy accents, and a button closure. This tutorial is fully based on the chart provided and written in detailed step-by-step American crochet terminology so beginners and intermediate crocheters can follow along confidently.



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## Materials Needed

- Size 10 crochet thread in:
  - Off-White
  - Green
  - Pink
  - Peach
  - Yellow
- 1.75 mm steel crochet hook
- Small tapestry needle
- Scissors
- 2 simple 4-hole buttons
- Measuring tape

## Finished Size

- Approximate bracelet length: 7 inches (18 cm)
- Width: about 1 inch (2.5 cm)

You can easily adjust the length by adding or removing lace motifs.

## Crochet Abbreviations

- ch = chain
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- tr = treble crochet
- sl st = slip stitch
- st = stitch
- sp = space
- rep = repeat
- cluster = crochet multiple stitches together in same stitch or space
- picot = ch 3, sl st in first ch

## Color Guide

- Off-White = lace band and button loops
- Green = centers and leaves
- Pink = rosebuds
- Peach = rosebuds
- Yellow = rosebuds

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## Bracelet Construction Overview

The bracelet is made in separate parts:

1. Circular lace motifs joined into a long band
2. Tiny rosebuds
3. Leaf motifs
4. Decorative flower clusters
5. Button loops
6. Buttons sewn onto each end

## Main Lace Band

The bracelet base consists of repeating circular lace motifs connected together.

### Step 1: Create the Green Center

Using green thread:

1. Make a magic ring.
2. Ch 2.
3. Work 16 dc into the ring.
4. Pull ring tight.
5. Join with sl st to top of first dc.

You should now have a neat circular center.

### Step 2: Begin Off-White Lace Round

Switch to off-white thread.

1. Attach off-white in any stitch.
2. Ch 5.
3. Skip next stitch.
4. Sc in following stitch.
5. Repeat around entire circle.

You should create evenly spaced loops around the green center.

Join with sl st into first chain loop.

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### **Step 3: Build Decorative Lace Arches**

Continue with off-white.

Into each loop:

1. Ch 3.
2. Work:
  - 2 dc
  - 1 tr
  - 2 dc
3. Ch 3.
4. Sc into next loop.

Repeat around.

This creates the scalloped lace edge seen in the chart.

### **Step 4: Add Outer Chain Loops**

1. Ch 5.
2. Sc between scallops.
3. Repeat around.

These loops prepare the motif for joining.

## **Joining the Lace Motifs**

The bracelet uses connected circular motifs.

### **Step 1: Make the Second Motif**

Create another motif exactly the same as the first.

### **Step 2: Join During Final Round**

While working the outer loops of the second motif:

1. Work half of a chain loop.
2. Sl st into matching loop of previous motif.
3. Finish remaining chains.
4. Continue pattern.

This creates seamless joins between circles.

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### **Step 3: Continue the Band**

Repeat until bracelet reaches desired length.

Suggested amount:

- About 10–12 motifs for a 7-inch bracelet.

## **Miniature Rosebud Pattern**

Make tiny roses in pink, peach, and yellow.

### **Step 1: Foundation Chain**

1. Ch 16.

### **Step 2: Create Petals**

Starting in second chain from hook:

1. Sc in next 2 chains.
2. Dc in next 3 chains.
3. 2 dc in next chain.
4. Continue increasing gently across chain.
5. End with sc in final stitches.

The strip should naturally curl.

### **Step 3: Roll the Rose**

1. Starting from first end, roll strip tightly.
2. Shape petals outward slightly.
3. Sew base securely using matching thread.

Make:

- 2 pink roses
- 2 yellow roses
- 2 peach roses

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## Leaf Motif

Using green thread:

### Step 1: Foundation

1. Ch 8.

### Step 2: Work Around Chain

Into chain:

- Sc
- Hdc
- Dc
- Tr
- Dc
- Hdc
- Sc

At tip:

- Ch 2
- Picot

Continue opposite side of chain using same stitch pattern.

### Step 3: Shape the Leaf

1. Pull slightly to shape.
2. Fasten off with long tail for sewing.

Make several leaves for flower clusters.

## Create Flower Clusters

Each decorative cluster contains:

- 2–3 roses
- 3–4 leaves

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## Cluster Placement

According to the chart:

- End cluster:
  - Pink + Yellow roses
- Center cluster:
  - Pink + Peach + Yellow roses
- Opposite end cluster:
  - Pink + Yellow roses

## Assembling Clusters

1. Arrange roses closely together.
2. Position leaves underneath.
3. Sew pieces securely onto lace band.

Keep stitches hidden underneath flowers.

## Button Loop Closure

Using off-white thread:

### Step 1: Create Loop

1. Attach thread to bracelet end.
2. Ch enough to fit around button comfortably.
3. Join back to bracelet forming loop.

### Step 2: Reinforce Loop

Work dc stitches around loop until fully covered.

This creates the padded oval loop shown in the diagram.

## Attach Buttons

Sew one button onto each bracelet end opposite the loops.

Check:

- Button fits securely through loop
- Bracelet closes comfortably

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## Final Assembly

1. Weave in all loose ends carefully.
2. Steam block lightly if desired.
3. Shape flowers and lace gently with fingers.

Your bracelet should now have:

- Elegant scalloped lace
- Delicate floral clusters
- Vintage romantic appearance
- Flexible comfortable fit

## Helpful Tips

### Keep Thread Tension Even

Consistent tension helps lace motifs stay symmetrical.

### Use Stitch Markers

Markers help identify joining points between motifs.

### Blocking Improves Appearance

Light blocking opens lace beautifully and enhances scallops.

### Customize Colors

You can substitute:

- Lavender roses
- Ivory lace
- Sage green leaves

while keeping the same structure.

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## Beginner Notes

If you are new to thread crochet:

- Work slowly
- Use bright lighting
- Count stitches frequently
- Finish one motif at a time

Thread crochet becomes much easier after the first few motifs.

## Care Instructions

- Hand wash gently in cool water
- Lay flat to dry
- Store flat to preserve flower shape
