

Crochet Floral Necklace Tutorial

Create a delicate floral crochet necklace with layered flowers, leaves, pearls, and dangling bead accents inspired by the chart pattern provided. This guide follows the structure and stitch flow shown in the diagram while expanding every step into a detailed beginner-friendly tutorial in US crochet terminology.

CLOSURE MECHANISM

MAIN VINE CHAIN & ASSEMBLY

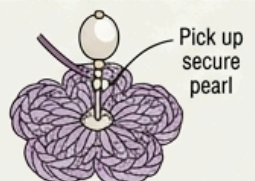
Start: ch 100, sc 1st row. **R2:** Leaf cluster at ch 25 (see Leaf pattern), attachment point for Large Purple Flower at ch 30.

Start: ch 100, sc 2nd row. **R2:** Leaf cluster at ch 25 (see Leaf pattern), and point at ch 30 for Large Purple Flower, at ch 30.

1st row. 1st. sc, 2nd. 3c, 20: 15t 30: 16h 30t.

R2: f cluster at ch row.

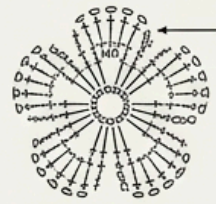
BEAD ATTACHMENT DETAIL



LARG DEEP PURPLE FLOWER (x3)



R1: MR, 12 dc
R2: [ch 3, dc, hdc, dc, ch 3, sl st] x5 petals



R1: MR, 10 dc
R2: [ch 2, dc, dc, hdc, ch 2, sl st]

GREEN LEAF (x10)

MEDIUM LAVENDER FLOWER

R1: MR, 10 dc

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Materials You Will Need

Yarn

Use size #10 crochet cotton thread in these colors:

- Purple
- Lavender
- Olive Green
- White

You may also substitute similar lace-weight crochet cotton thread.

Hook

- Steel crochet hook size 1.25 mm / US 00

Jewelry Supplies

- Lobster clasp
- Small jump rings
- Jewelry pliers
- 6 mm safety pearl or round bead
- Assorted small beads and pearl dangles
- Needle and sewing thread for attaching beads

Helpful Tools

- Small scissors
- Stitch markers
- Yarn needle
- Measuring tape

US Crochet Abbreviations

- MR = Magic Ring
- ch = chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- tr = treble crochet
- dtr = double treble crochet
- cluster-tr = treble cluster
- tr-cluster = grouped treble stitches
- picot = chain picot

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Main Chain Base

Start with olive green thread.

Step 1: Create the Foundation Chain

Chain enough stitches to comfortably fit around the neck.

For an average adult necklace:

- Chain approximately 140–160 stitches.

The chain should curve naturally around the neckline.

Step 2: Reinforce the Chain

Work:

- 1 hdc in every chain across

This creates a stronger necklace base and prevents stretching.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Large Flower Pattern

Make 5 large flowers total:

- 2 lavender flowers
- 2 dark purple flowers
- 1 center flower

Round 1

Begin with chosen flower color.

Create a magic ring.

Work:

- 8 sc into the magic ring

Pull ring tight and join with sl st.

You now have 8 stitches.

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Round 2

In each stitch around work:

- dc-cluster
- ch 3

Repeat around 8 times.

Join with sl st.

Round 3

Into each ch-3 space work:

- dc-cluster
- ch 3

Repeat around 8 times.

Join with sl st.

Fasten off.

The flower should look full and layered.

Flower Center

Sew a pearl or bead in the center of each flower.

Use sewing thread for extra security.

Small Decorative Flower Pattern

Make multiple small flowers using white thread.

Round 1

Create a magic ring.

Work:

- 6 sc into ring

Join with sl st.

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Round 2

In each stitch work:

- ch 2
- 2 dc
- ch 2
- sl st

Repeat around all stitches.

This creates tiny petals.

Fasten off leaving tail for sewing.

Small Leaf Pattern

Work leaves in rows using olive green thread.

Make many leaves in varying sizes.

Row 1

Chain 8.

Row 2

Starting in 2nd chain from hook:

- 1 sc
- 3 hdc
- 1 dc
- 1 sc
- sl st in final chain

Turn slightly to continue working along opposite side if desired.

Row 3

Chain 8.

Row 4

Work:

- dc in next stitch

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Row 5

Work:

- dc in next stitch

Fasten off.

Shape the leaf gently with fingers.

Crochet Vine Accent

Using purple or lavender thread:

Step 1

Chain desired vine length.

Step 2

Work loosely:

- sl st
- sc
- hdc randomly along chain

This creates a natural twisting vine appearance.

Make several vine pieces for decoration.

Pearl and Bead Dangles

These dangling accents give the necklace movement and elegance.

Step 1

Thread beads onto jewelry pins or sewing thread.

Step 2

Attach beads using jump rings.

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Step 3

Sew or connect bead dangles around:

- flowers
- vines
- leaves

Distribute evenly for balance.

Necklace Assembly Guide

Lay all crochet pieces on a flat table before attaching.

Arrange symmetrically using the chart as reference.

Step 1: Attach Main Flowers

Place:

- 1 large flower in center
- 2 flowers on left side
- 2 flowers on right side

Sew securely onto the crochet chain base.

Step 2: Add Leaves

Sew leaves around flowers.

Angle leaves outward naturally.

Use varying directions to imitate real foliage.

Step 3: Add Small Flowers

Fill empty spaces using white flowers.

Cluster tiny flowers near larger blooms.

Step 4: Attach Crochet Vines

Position vines flowing downward and outward.

Secure at several hidden points.

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Allow some sections to curve naturally.

Step 5: Add Bead Dangles

Attach dangling beads around:

- lower curves
- side flowers
- vine ends

Do not overcrowd the design.

The necklace should remain lightweight.

Chain Extender Detail

Create a simple extender chain.

Step 1

Attach thread or jewelry chain to one necklace end.

Step 2

Add approximately:

- 2–3 inches of extension chain

Step 3

Secure tightly using jump rings.

Lobster Clasp Assembly

Step 1

Attach a jump ring to one necklace side.

Step 2

Connect lobster clasp.

Step 3

Attach extender chain to opposite side.

Test clasp opening and closing several times.

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Final Shaping and Finishing

Block the Crochet Pieces

Lightly steam or wet block flowers and leaves.

Shape petals carefully by hand.

Allow to dry completely.

Secure All Ends

Weave in every yarn tail firmly.

Double-check bead attachments.

Final Inspection

Ensure:

- flowers are balanced
- necklace curves naturally
- clasp feels secure
- beads are tightly attached

Tips for Best Results

- Keep flower tension consistent.
- Use sharp embroidery scissors for clean finishing.
- Smaller hooks produce cleaner lace details.
- Mix lavender shades for a more realistic floral look.
- Attach beads after final assembly to avoid tangling.

Suggested Finished Size

- Necklace circumference: 18–22 inches
- Extender: 2–3 inches

Beginner Notes

If this is your first crochet jewelry project:

- Practice the magic ring before starting.
- Make one flower first as a test sample.
- Use stitch markers during repeats.
- Work slowly when attaching beads and jewelry findings.

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The project becomes much easier after completing the first flower and leaf set.

Finished Result

You will have an elegant handcrafted floral crochet necklace featuring:

- dimensional flowers
- textured leaves
- flowing vines
- pearl accents
- delicate bead dangles
