

Crochet Floral Lace Square Motif Blanket Tutorial

This tutorial is based on the crochet chart provided and is written in clear US crochet terminology. The design features a delicate floral lace motif with three flower buds at the top, leaves at the bottom, and an openwork lace background. Follow each section carefully from beginning to end.

Round 1: Chain (ch), Single Crochet (sc)

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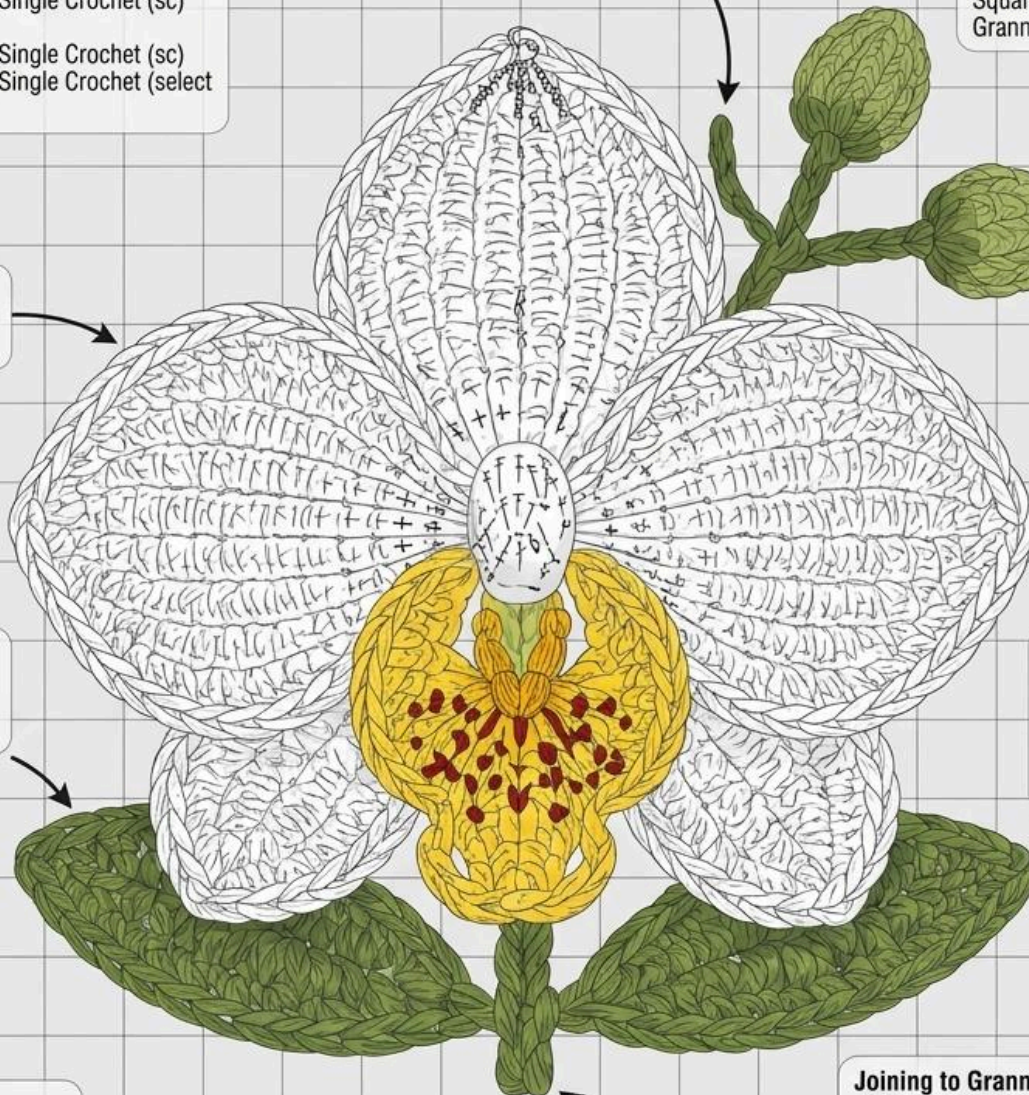

Round 1: Chain (cl, Single Crochet (sc)
Round 2: Pedlar, Single Crochet (sc)
Round 3: Chain to Single Crochet (sc)
Round 4: Atim
Round 5: Corner, Single Crochet (si)
Round 6: Remand Single Crochet (sc)
Round 7: Lows Single Crochet (sc)
Round 8: Join



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Materials Needed

- Lightweight cotton crochet thread or fingering-weight yarn
- Crochet hook suitable for your yarn (typically 2.5 mm–3.5 mm)
- Scissors
- Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Stitch markers (optional)

Stitch Abbreviations (US Terms)

- ch = chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- tr = treble crochet

Finished Motif Overview

The motif is worked from the center outward. First, the central flower is created, followed by the surrounding petals, decorative leaves, flower buds, and finally the square border.

The chart contains rounds numbered from the center and progresses outward until the square frame is completed.

Step 1: Create the Center Ring

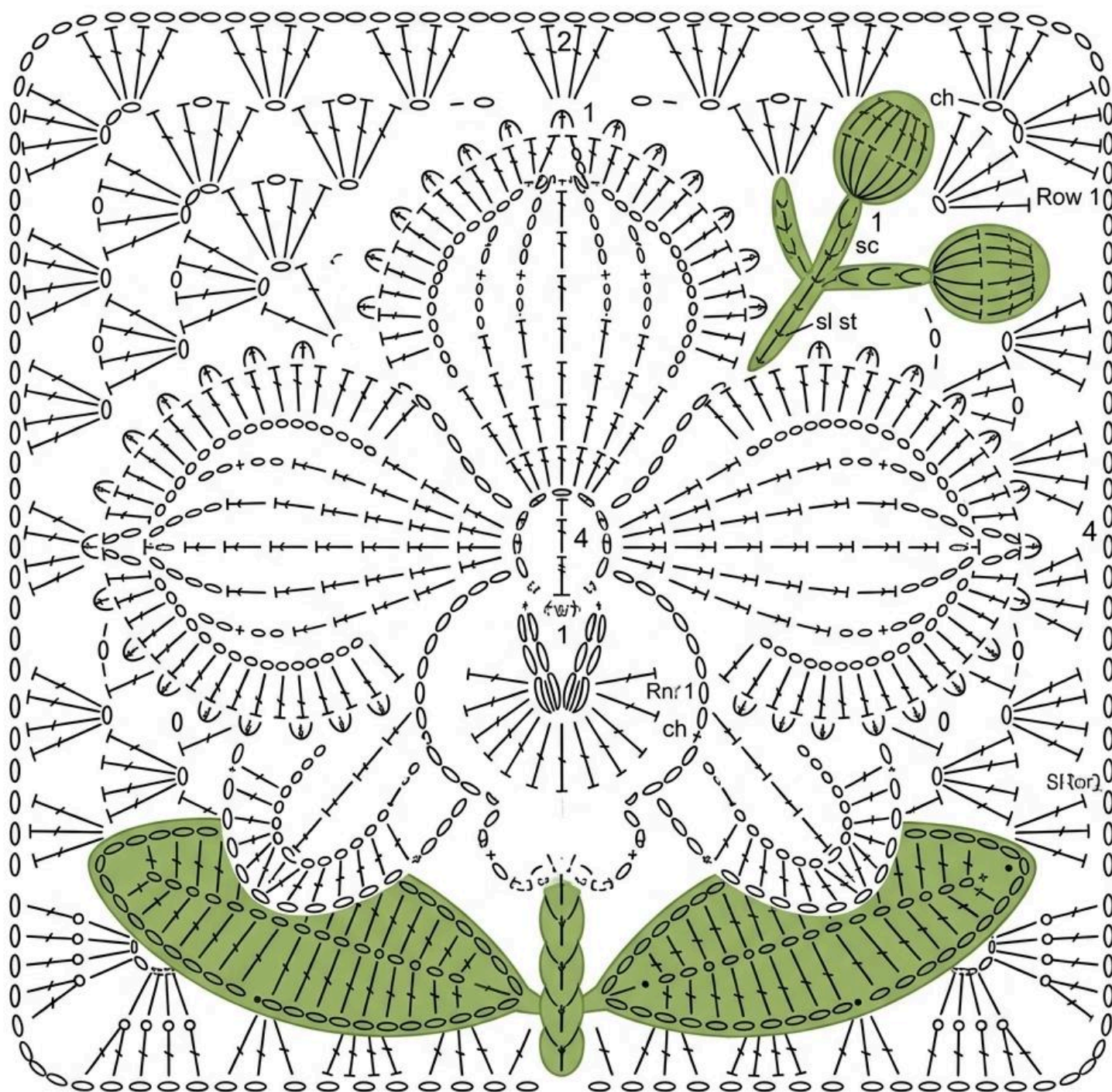
Begin with:

- Ch 6
- Join with a sl st into the first chain to form a ring

Round 1:

- Ch 3 (counts as first dc)
- Work 23 dc into the ring
- Join with a sl st to the top of beginning ch-3

You should now have 24 dc forming a complete circle.

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Step 2: Build the Central Flower Base

Round 2:

- Ch 4
- Skip 1 stitch
- Sc in next stitch
- Ch 4
- Skip 1 stitch
- Sc in next stitch

Repeat around the circle.

You should create evenly spaced chain loops surrounding the center.

Join with a sl st.

These loops will become the foundation for the flower petals.

Step 3: Create the Large Flower Petals

Work into each chain loop from Round 2.

For each petal:

- Sc in loop
- 2 hdc
- 5 dc
- 2 hdc
- Sc

Repeat for every loop around.

As the petals are completed, a flower shape begins to emerge.

Join with a sl st.

Step 4: Form the Inner Petal Outlines

The chart shows decorative chains around each petal.

Work:

- Ch 5
- Sl st between petals
- Ch 5
- Sl st between petals

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Continue around all petals.

This creates the lace framework that surrounds the flower center.

Step 5: Create the Side Petal Extensions

The elongated petals extending left and right are worked separately on the lace framework.

For each side petal:

Row 1:

- Attach yarn at indicated joining point
- Ch 3
- Work dc stitches across the chain space section shown in the chart

Rows 2–4:

- Increase gradually at both ends
- Follow the petal shape shown
- Maintain smooth oval shaping

Final Petal Edge:

Work around the petal:

- Sc evenly around
- Ch 1 at tip points
- Sl st to finish

Make one petal on the left side and one matching petal on the right side.

Step 6: Create the Lower Leaves

The lower section contains two large leaves.

Each leaf is worked separately.

Foundation:

- Ch 18

Row 1:

- Sc in second chain from hook
- Sc across

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Row 2:

- Ch 1, turn
- Increase at beginning and end
- Work dc stitches across

Rows 3–6:

- Continue increasing gradually
- Follow the oval leaf shape visible in the chart

Leaf Border:

Work around entire leaf:

- Sc evenly
- Ch 2 at leaf tip
- Continue down opposite side

Fasten off.

Create:

- Left leaf
- Right leaf

Make them symmetrical.

Step 7: Crochet the Center Stem

The center stem is worked between the two leaves.

Foundation:

- Ch 12

Work:

- Sc in each chain

Create small stacked leaf sections by working:

- Ch 3
- Sc back into stem
- Ch 3
- Sc back into stem

Repeat until the decorative stem shown in the chart is complete.

Attach stem between both leaves.

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Step 8: Create the Upper Flower Stems

The chart shows three flower stems extending upward.

Attach yarn at the top center of the flower.

For each stem:

- Ch 12–15
- Sl st back along the chain

Create:

- Left stem
- Center stem
- Right stem

Position them exactly as shown in the chart.

Step 9: Crochet the Flower Buds

Make three identical buds.

Foundation:

- Ch 8

Round 1:

- Work sc around both sides of the chain
- Join

Round 2:

- Increase evenly using dc stitches

Round 3:

- Continue shaping into an oval

Round 4:

- Work dc around

Round 5:

- Decrease slightly toward top

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Round 6:

- Sc around

Fasten off.

Create three buds.

Attach one to each stem.

Step 10: Add Bud Sepals

At the base of each bud:

- Ch 4
- Sl st into bud
- Ch 4
- Sl st into bud

Repeat around base.

This creates the small green leaf-like sections beneath each flower bud.

Step 11: Construct the Lace Framework ✨

Now begin building the openwork lace area surrounding the floral arrangement.

Work chain arches exactly as shown:

- Ch 7
- Attach with sc
- Ch 7
- Attach with sc

Continue around the motif.

The chart displays numerous arches that connect:

- Flower petals
- Side petals
- Lower leaves
- Upper buds

Maintain even tension throughout.

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Step 12: Build the Decorative Fan Sections

The corners and side areas contain fan motifs.

Into designated chain spaces:

- 7 dc
- Ch 1
- 7 dc

Attach with sc into neighboring arches.

Repeat around the motif.

These fans gradually form the square shape.

Step 13: Create the Outer Floral Mesh

Continue following the chain arches shown around the entire design.

Work:

- Ch 5
- Sc
- Ch 5
- Sc

Repeat.

Then on the next round:

- Work dc groups into selected arches

This creates the decorative lattice visible around the flowers.

Step 14: Form the Square Corners

At each corner:

- Work 11 dc into corner space
- Ch 3
- 11 dc into same space

This creates the rounded corner fans shown in the chart.

Repeat for all four corners.

The motif should now clearly resemble a square.

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Step 15: Work the Final Border Round

Around the entire motif:

Side sections:

- Dc evenly across

Corner sections:

- 2 dc
- Ch 2
- 2 dc

Repeat around.

Join with a sl st.

Step 16: Finishing Touches

- Fasten off yarn
- Weave in all loose ends
- Block the motif gently
- Pin corners evenly
- Allow to dry completely

Blocking is highly recommended because it opens the lacework and defines the flower and leaf details.

Assembly Ideas

You can use this motif for:

- Vintage lace blankets
- Decorative table runners
- Cushion covers
- Wall hangings
- Bedspreads
- Lace curtains
- Heirloom crochet projects

To create a larger blanket, make multiple motifs and join them using:

- Slip stitch join
- Single crochet join

The finished result is an elegant botanical lace square featuring a central flower, side petals, lower leaves, and three blooming buds framed within a decorative square border.
