

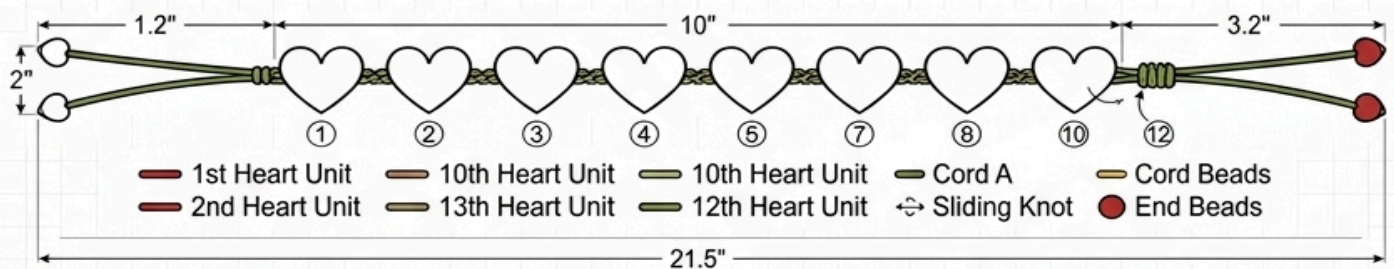
Heart Motif Crochet Bracelet

This crochet bracelet is made from a series of connected heart motifs worked in a continuous sequence, following the stitch diagram provided. The design creates a delicate bracelet made of small hearts joined together and finished with a simple chain-loop closure.

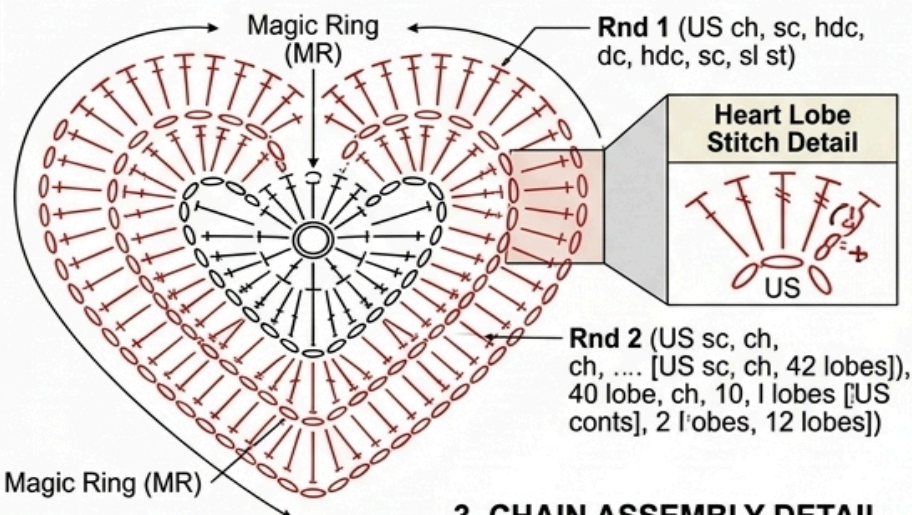
TECHNICAL CROCHET PATTERN DIAGRAM - RED HEART CHAIN BRACELET

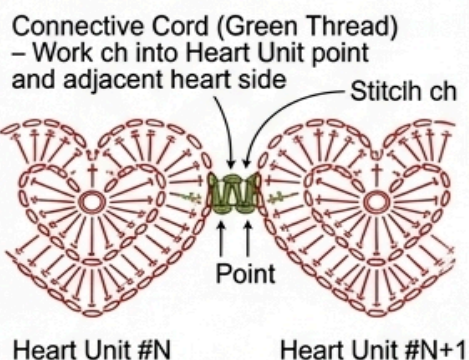
MATERIALS NEEDED:

- Thread 1: Red (approx. 20m, 6-strand cotton)
- Thread 2: Olive Green (approx. 10m, 6-strand cotton)
- Crochet Hook: 1.50mm
- Small Beads: 4x Red

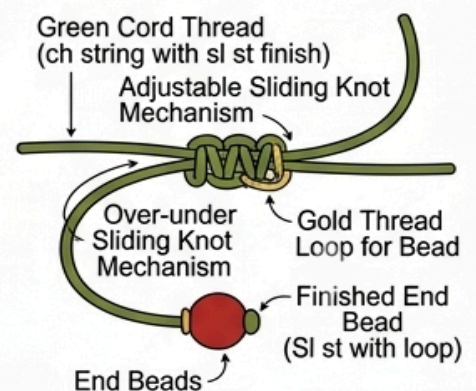

US Crochet Symbols

- = ch (English names)
- + = sc
- ⌣ = hdc († with tross)
- ⌣⌣ = with 2 crosses: dc
- = sl st

Skill Level: Easy to Intermediate

Finished Size: Adjustable depending on the number of hearts made

Construction: Hearts are crocheted individually and joined as you work, then finished with a chain-loop clasp.

Materials

- Lightweight cotton crochet thread or fine yarn
- Crochet hook appropriate for your yarn
- Scissors
- Tapestry needle for weaving in ends

Abbreviations

- ch = chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- st = stitch
- sp = space

Notes Before You Begin

- Each heart is worked into a small center ring.
- Hearts are joined together using short chain bridges.
- The bracelet length is adjusted by adding or removing hearts.
- The chart shows approximately 8 hearts connected into a bracelet with a chain-loop closure.

Step 1: Create the First Heart

Begin with:

- Ch 4.
- Join with a sl st to the first chain to form a ring.

Work all stitches into the center of the ring:

- 3 dc
- 3 hdc
- 1 dc
- Ch 1
- 1 dc
- 3 hdc
- 3 dc
- Ch 1
- Sl st into the ring

This forms one complete heart shape.

Gently shape the heart with your fingers before continuing.

Step 2: Create the First Connecting Bridge

After completing the first heart:

- Ch 5

This chain forms the connection between the first and second heart.

Step 3: Crochet the Second Heart

Create another center ring:

- Ch 4
- Join with a sl st to form a ring

Work the same heart pattern into the ring:

- 3 dc
- 3 hdc
- 1 dc
- Ch 1
- 1 dc
- 3 hdc
- 3 dc
- Ch 1

- Sl st into the ring

You now have two hearts connected by a chain bridge.

Step 4: Continue Adding Hearts

Repeat the following sequence:

- Ch 5
- Create a new ring
- Crochet one heart into the ring

Continue until the bracelet reaches the desired wrist length.

For an average adult wrist:

- 7–9 hearts usually work well.

For a smaller wrist:

- 6–7 hearts.

For a larger wrist:

- 9–10 hearts.

Before finishing, wrap the bracelet around your wrist to check the fit.

Step 5: Form the Bracelet Circle

Once the final heart has been completed:

- Ch 5

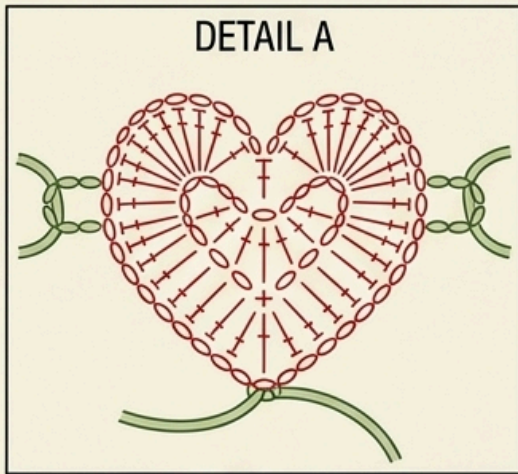
Bring the two ends together.

Join the final chain bridge to the first heart with a sl st as shown in the chart.

Make sure none of the hearts are twisted before joining.

The bracelet should now form a complete circle.

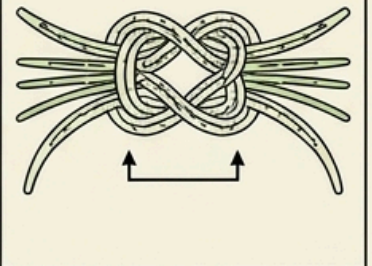

ASSEMBLY SEQUENCE:

1. Complete all Heart Units.
2. Work cord A and thread beads.
3. Join chain sections with sl st.
4. Work cord B.
5. Construct sliding knot.

Step 6: Crochet the Closure Loop

At the top of the bracelet, create the loop shown in the diagram.

Work:

- Ch 18–25

Adjust the number of chains according to the size of your chosen button or bead.

Bring the chain back to the starting point.

Join with a sl st to form a loop.

Step 7: Reinforce the Loop

To make the closure stronger:

Work along the chain loop with:

- 1 sc in each chain

or

- 1 sl st in each chain for a thinner finish.

Join with a sl st.

Fasten off.

Step 8: Create the Button Closure

The chart shows a small decorative circular element opposite the loop.

To make it:

- Ch 4
- Join into a ring

Into the ring work:

- 8 sc

Join with a sl st.

Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing.

Sew this small crochet circle securely to the opposite end of the bracelet.

The loop should fit comfortably over the crochet button.

Step 9: Finishing ✨

- Fasten off all yarn ends.
- Use a tapestry needle to weave in loose ends.
- Block lightly if desired.
- Shape each heart carefully so the points and curves are clearly defined.

Adjusting the Bracelet Size

To Make It Smaller

- Use fewer hearts.
- Reduce connecting chains from 5 to 4.

To Make It Larger

- Add additional hearts.
- Increase connecting chains from 5 to 6 or 7.

To Make It More Delicate

- Use crochet thread and a smaller hook.

To Make It More Bold

- Use fine yarn and a slightly larger hook.

Stitch Pattern Summary

Each heart:

- Ch 4, join into ring
- 3 dc
- 3 hdc
- 1 dc
- Ch 1
- 1 dc
- 3 hdc
- 3 dc
- Ch 1
- Sl st

Between hearts:

- Ch 5

Closure loop:

- Ch 18–25
- Join into loop
- Cover with sc or sl st

Button:

- Ch 4
- Join into ring
- 8 sc
- Join and fasten off
