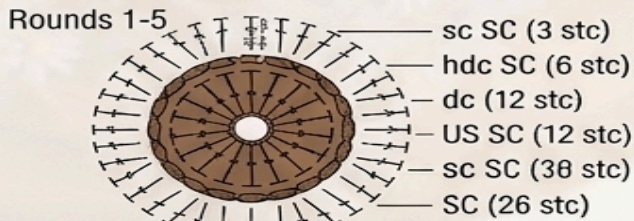


Sunflower Crochet Bracelet Pattern

This beginner-friendly project uses basic crochet stitches and simple assembly techniques to create a beautiful accessory perfect for everyday wear or as a thoughtful handmade gift. 🌻

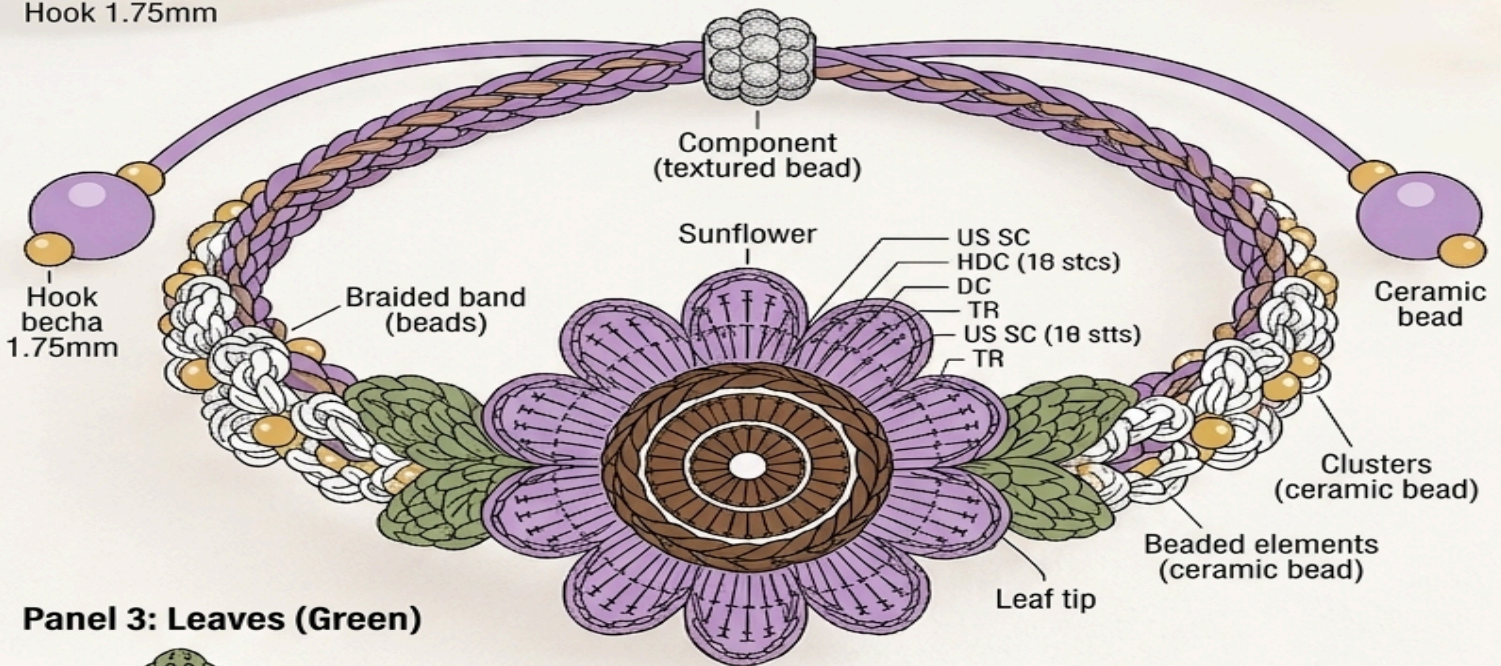
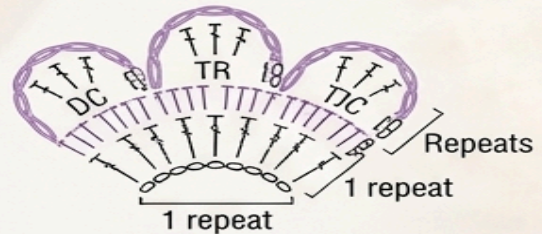
DETAILED DIAGRAM OF THE SUNFLOWER BRACELET (TRADITIONAL US STITCHES)

Panel 1: Sunflower Center (Brown)

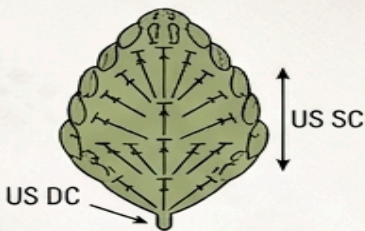


Hook 1.75mm

Panel 2: Sunflower Petals (Purple)



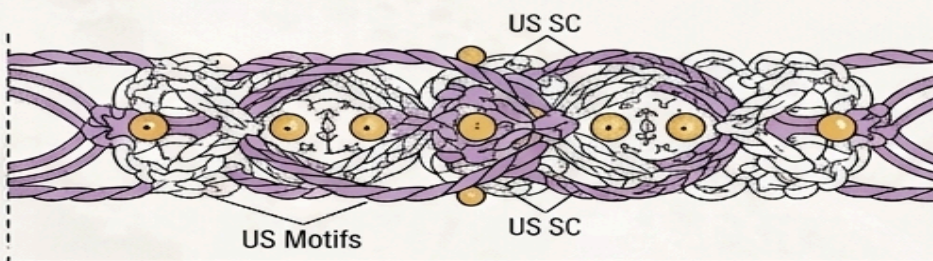
Panel 3: Leaves (Green)

- × sc (single crochet)
- ┆ hdc (half double crochet)
- ┆ dc (double crochet)
- ┆ tr (treble crochet)
- st (stitch)
- sl st (slip stitch)

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Pattern Information

Skill Level: Easy to Intermediate

Finished Size: Approximately 7–8 inches (18–20 cm) long, adjustable.

Terminology: US Crochet Terms

Construction: The bracelet is worked in separate sections. Begin with the sunflower, crochet the leaves, add the textured side bands, braid the straps, and finish with an adjustable sliding closure.

Materials

- Size 10 crochet thread in golden yellow
- Size 10 crochet thread in brown
- Size 10 crochet thread in light green
- Size 10 crochet thread in lavender or light purple
- 1.50 mm steel crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Small scissors
- Stitch marker (optional)
- Measuring tape

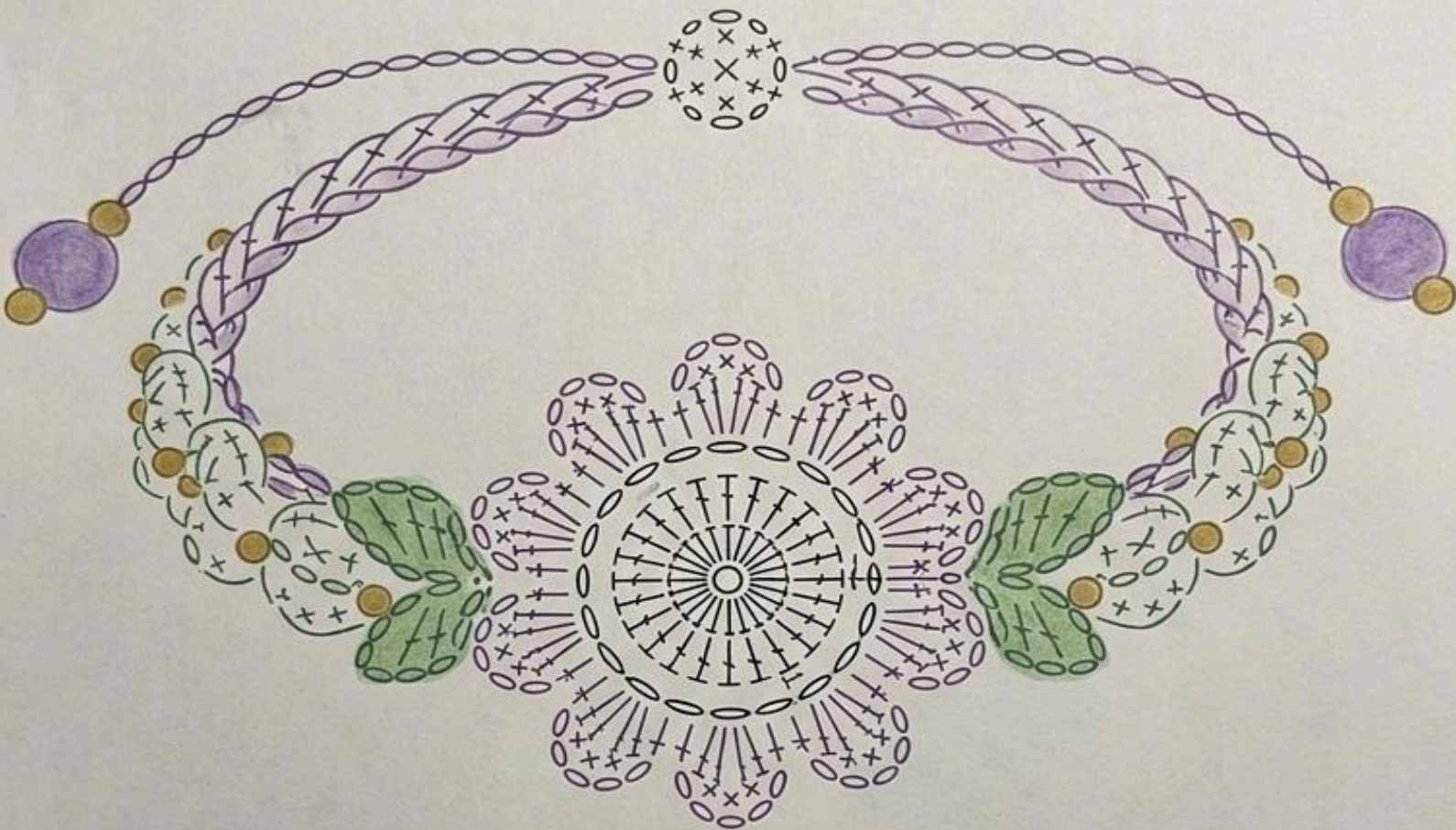
Crochet Abbreviations

- ch – chain
- sl st – slip stitch
- sc – single crochet
- hdc – half double crochet
- dc – double crochet
- tr – treble crochet
- st – stitch
- sp – space
- rnd – round
- rep – repeat
- FO – fasten off

Before You Begin

Read through the entire pattern before starting. Keep your stitches even and avoid pulling the thread too tightly, especially while making the flower petals and braided straps. Blocking the finished bracelet will help define the flower and leaves.

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Step 1 – Crochet the Sunflower Center

Using brown thread:

Make a magic ring.

Round 1:

Work 12 sc into the magic ring.

Pull the ring closed tightly.

Join with a slip stitch to the first sc.

Round 2:

Chain 2.

Work 2 dc into each stitch around.

Join with a slip stitch.

Fasten off the brown thread.

The center should be flat and perfectly round.

Step 2 – Crochet the Sunflower Petals

Join the yellow thread to any stitch around the flower center.

Work each petal as follows:

- Chain 2.
- Work 2 dc.
- Work 1 tr.
- Work 2 dc.
- Chain 2.
- Slip stitch into the next stitch.

Repeat this sequence evenly around the flower until you have a full circle of petals.

Each petal should be slightly rounded and overlap naturally with the next, creating the appearance of a blooming sunflower.

Fasten off and weave in the ends.

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Step 3 – Crochet the Left Leaf

Using green thread:

Chain 8.

Beginning in the second chain from the hook:

- 1 sc
- 1 hdc
- 3 dc
- 1 hdc
- 3 sc in the last chain

Continue working along the opposite side of the foundation chain:

- 1 hdc
- 3 dc
- 1 hdc
- 1 sc

Join with a slip stitch.

Create a center vein by slip stitching down the middle of the leaf.

Fasten off.

Step 4 – Crochet the Right Leaf

Repeat the same instructions to make a second matching leaf.

Position both leaves symmetrically on each side of the sunflower.

Step 5 – Crochet the Left Decorative Band

Using lavender thread:

Chain enough stitches to reach approximately one-third of the bracelet length.

Work one row of sc.

Continue with additional rows using a combination of sc and hdc to create a softly curved decorative band similar to the diagram.

Along the outer edge, add small decorative picot-like bumps by working:

- Chain 3
- Slip stitch into the first chain

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- Skip one stitch
- Single crochet into the next stitch

Repeat evenly along the edge.

The band should gradually curve toward the flower.

Step 6 – Crochet the Right Decorative Band

Repeat the previous section, making the second band as a mirror image.

Both sides should have the same width and length.

Step 7 – Join the Leaves

Sew one leaf onto each side of the sunflower.

Attach the decorative bands directly behind the leaves.

Ensure both sides remain symmetrical before securing all stitches.

Weave in all loose ends carefully.

Step 8 – Create the Braided Straps

Using three strands of lavender thread for each side:

Cut three equal lengths approximately 16 inches (40 cm) long.

Tie the strands together with a secure knot.

Braid them evenly until reaching the desired length.

Tie another knot at the end.

Repeat for the opposite side.

Attach one braid securely to each decorative band.

Step 9 – Crochet the Adjustable Sliding Closure

Using lavender thread:

Chain 18.

Join into a small ring around both braided cords without catching them permanently.

Work 20 sc around the ring.

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Join with a slip stitch.

Fasten off securely.

The braided cords should slide smoothly through the closure, allowing the bracelet to adjust comfortably to different wrist sizes.

Step 10 – Add the Decorative End Beads

Thread one bead onto each braided end.

Tie a secure overhand knot beneath each bead to keep it in place.

Trim the thread ends evenly.

The beads add both decoration and weight, making the braided ties easier to adjust.

Step 11 – Shape the Bracelet

Lightly dampen the bracelet.

Pin the flower, leaves, and side bands into their proper shape.

Allow everything to dry completely before removing the pins.

Blocking helps the petals open beautifully and keeps the bracelet lying flat.

Finished Bracelet

Your handmade sunflower bracelet features:

- A textured sunflower centerpiece
- Two decorative green leaves
- Curved crocheted side bands
- Braided adjustable straps
- Decorative bead accents
- Comfortable adjustable fit
