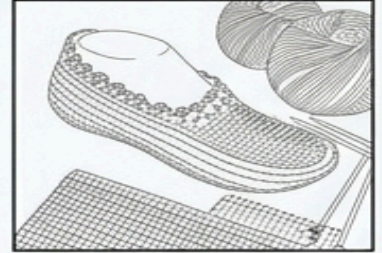


Crochet Slipper Socks with Matching Ribbed Washcloth Pattern

SLIPPER-SOCK TUTORIAL: From Pattern to Piece



Reference Chart: Stitch Legend

PROJECT GUIDE

STEP 1: UNDERSTAND THE SHAPE

The chart details a rectangular 'U'-shaped piece for the foot bed and a separate narrow strip for the heel. We'll start with the main piece.

STEP 2: MATERIALS

Approx. 100g of Sage Green DK weight yarn (see balls). US Size G/6 (4mm) crochet hook (see stylized hook). Tapestry needle, scissors, measuring tape.

FULL TUTORIAL: U.S. CROCHET TERMS

BEGIN THE MAIN PIECE (Sole & Sides)

FOUNDATION CHAIN (ch):
Start with 42 ch stitches (adjust length to desired foot size).



ROW 1: SINGLE CROCHET (sc):
Chain 1 (turning ch, doesn't count), work 41 sc. (41 sts)



SIDE PANEL PATTERN

UNDERSTANDING THE CHART
Follow the 7-row repeat of the textured stitch. This stitch creates the 'bumpy'. Detailed description in Step 2.2.



TEXTURED STITCH (sc in BLO):

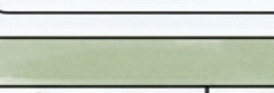
Row A (Right Side - RS): Single Crochet
Row B (Wrong Side - WS): Single Crochet in Back Loop Only (BLO).
Repeat these two rows to build the textured side.
Continue pattern for 10 repeats (or until 3 inches/7.5cm tall).

HEEL & FINISHING

FORMING THE 'U' SHAPE:

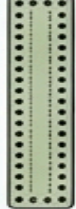
To finish the main piece, you will only work across 21 stitches for 10 rows to create the shorter, inner side of the U-shape. "Wait, let's trace the chart."

The chart shows a full-width section section. Work across 21 sts. Decr 1 st at heel end every row (sc2tog). Contin for 10 rows. Repeat textured pat until total height is 5 inches/12.5cm.



MAKE HEEL STRIP:

Attach new yarn to the center of the heel (marked with dots and slip stitches). Follow the narrow 5-row pattern:
Row 1 (WS): 8 ch, sl st.
Row 2-4: work 8 sc.
Row 5: 8 sc.
Fasten off. Use the sl st join as shown.



ASSEMBLY & SCALLOPING:

Seam the back of the heel and the sole together. The last step is the 'SCALLOPED EDGE'. This is a detailed below in the US Stitch Guide. Use a US sc2tog (sc decrease) at the toe and heel.

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Create a cozy pair of crochet slipper socks and a matching ribbed washcloth using simple stitches and an easy-to-follow construction. This tutorial is based on the stitch chart shown above and follows the same visual structure as closely as possible. The pattern uses only basic crochet stitches, making it suitable for adventurous beginners and experienced crocheters alike.

Skill Level: Easy to Intermediate

Language: US Crochet Terms

Finished Projects:

- One pair of crochet slipper socks
- One matching ribbed washcloth

Construction Method:

- The slipper begins at the sole.
- The sides are built upward.
- The toe is shaped naturally.
- The top opening is finished with a decorative scalloped edge.
- The washcloth is crocheted flat in rows using the same stitch texture.

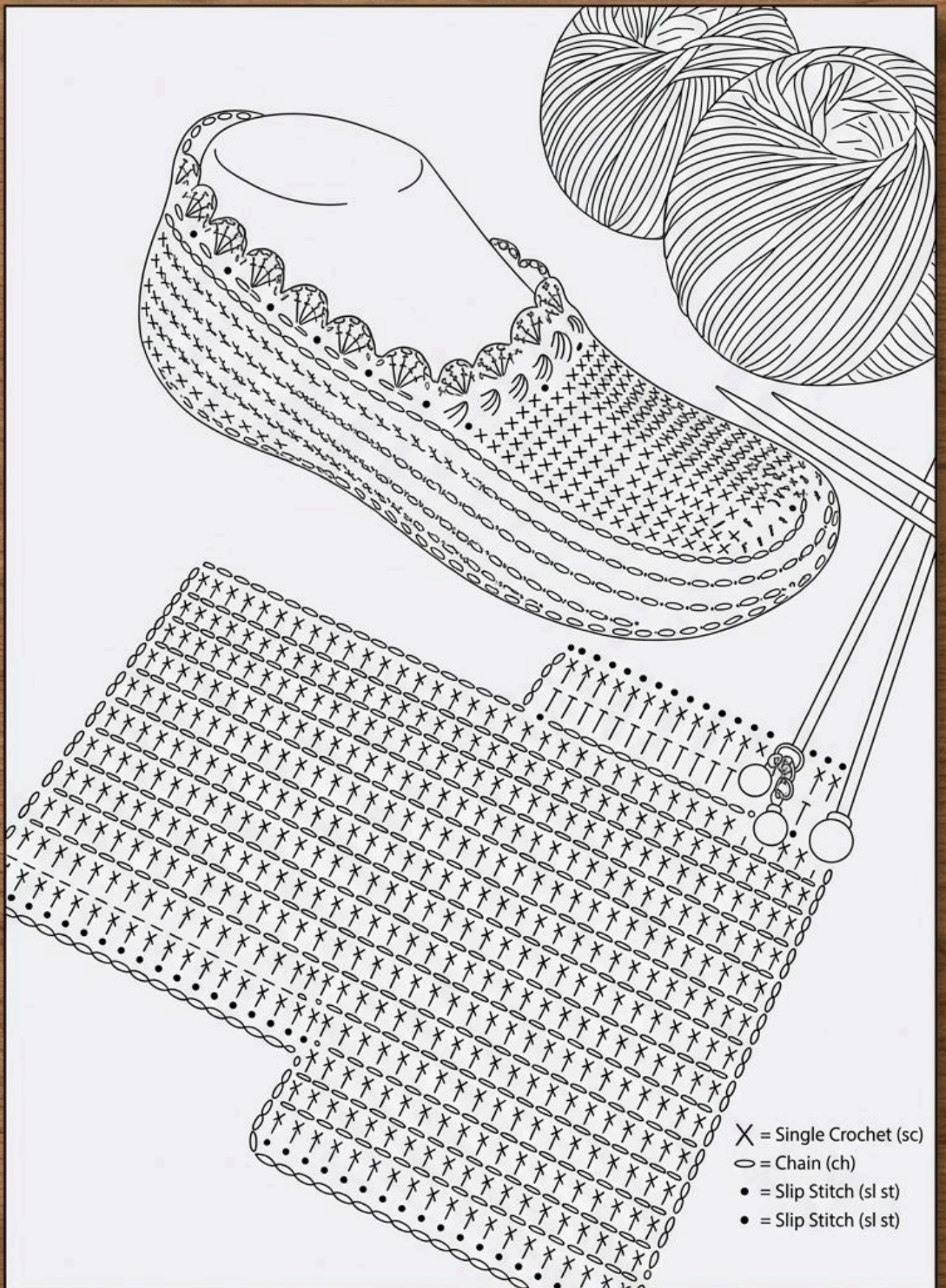
Materials

- Worsted Weight (#4) Cotton or Cotton Blend Yarn
- Approx. 220–300 yards for one pair of slippers
- Approx. 70 yards for one washcloth
- 4.0 mm (G/6) crochet hook
- Stitch markers
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Measuring tape

Crochet Abbreviations

- ch = Chain
- sc = Single Crochet
- sl st = Slip Stitch
- st = Stitch
- rep = Repeat
- RS = Right Side
- WS = Wrong Side
- BLO = Back Loop Only

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Pattern Notes

- This pattern uses US crochet terminology.
- Chain 1 at the beginning of a row does not count as a stitch.
- Maintain even tension throughout the project.
- Count stitches frequently.
- The slippers stretch slightly after wearing.
- The ribbed texture is created by working in the back loop only where indicated.
- The decorative edge is worked after the slipper body is complete.

Finished Measurements

Women's Medium (Adjustable)

- Length: approximately 9½ inches
- Width: approximately 3¾ inches

To adjust the size, simply add or subtract foundation chains and work additional or fewer body rows.

Gauge

18 Single Crochet × 20 Rows = 4 inches

Gauge is not absolutely critical but helps ensure the slipper fits correctly.

Step 1 – Crochet the Sole

Begin with:

Chain 25.

Round 1

Starting in the second chain from the hook:

- 23 sc
- 3 sc in the last chain
- Continue working along the opposite side
- 22 sc
- 2 sc in the final stitch
- Join with a slip stitch.

Round 2

Chain 1.

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Work one sc into every stitch.

Increase evenly around both curved ends by placing two single crochet stitches into every third stitch around each curve.

Join with a slip stitch.

Round 3

Chain 1.

Work one sc into every stitch.

Continue increasing gently around the toe and heel until the sole measures approximately 3¾ inches wide.

Fasten off.

The completed sole should have a smooth oval shape exactly like the chart.

Step 2 – Build the Side Walls

Attach yarn at the heel.

Round 1

Chain 1.

Work one single crochet into every stitch around.

Do not increase.

Join with a slip stitch.

Rounds 2–8

Chain 1.

Work one single crochet in each stitch around.

No increases.

This creates the walls of the slipper.

The slipper should now begin curling upward naturally.

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Step 3 – Shape the Toe

Locate the center front.

Place a stitch marker.

Beginning several stitches before the marker:

Work single crochet until reaching the center section.

Decrease across the front by working:

- sc2tog
- sc
- sc2tog

Continue around normally.

Join.

Repeat this decrease round until the toe gently curves inward.

The toe should resemble the rounded front shown in the stitch chart.

Do not over-tighten the decreases.

The toe should remain smooth.

Step 4 – Continue the Upper Foot

Continue crocheting even rounds.

Work one single crochet into every stitch.

Repeat until the slipper reaches the front of the ankle.

Try the slipper on before continuing.

The opening should comfortably fit over the foot.

Step 5 – Create the Decorative Scalloped Edge

Attach yarn at the back heel.

Work the following repeat around the opening:

Skip one stitch.

Work:

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5 single crochet into the next stitch.

Skip one stitch.

Slip stitch into the following stitch.

Repeat this sequence all the way around.

Adjust slightly near the end if necessary so the pattern finishes evenly.

Fasten off.

Weave in the ends securely.

The finished edge should resemble the scalloped trim shown in the chart.

Step 6 – Make the Second Slipper

Repeat every step exactly.

Compare both slippers frequently while crocheting.

This helps maintain identical sizing.

Step 7 – Crochet the Matching Ribbed Washcloth 🧺

Chain 41.

Row 1

Beginning in the second chain from hook:

Work one single crochet in every chain.

Turn.

Rows 2–42

Chain 1.

Work every stitch in the back loop only.

Turn.

This creates the raised horizontal ribbing seen in the chart.

Continue until the washcloth forms a nearly square shape.

Fasten off.

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Step 8 – Add the Hanging Loop

Attach yarn to one corner.

Chain 12.

Slip stitch back into the same corner.

Fasten off.

Weave in ends securely.

Finishing

Using a yarn needle:

- Weave in every yarn tail.
- Trim excess yarn.
- Check for loose stitches.
- Lightly steam block if desired.
- Allow the project to dry completely before use.

Size Adjustments

For Smaller Sizes

- Begin with fewer foundation chains.
- Work fewer body rounds.
- Decrease the toe slightly earlier.

For Larger Sizes

- Add 2–4 foundation chains.
- Add extra body rounds.
- Continue even rounds until reaching the desired length before shaping the toe.

Helpful Tips

- Keep your stitches relaxed for maximum comfort.
- Cotton yarn creates breathable slippers.
- Acrylic yarn provides extra warmth.
- Use stitch markers to keep the toe centered.
- Count stitches after every round.
- Try the slipper on several times while crocheting.
- Block both slippers together for a matching finish.

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Care Instructions

- Machine wash on gentle cycle.
- Wash in cold water.
- Lay flat to dry.
- Do not bleach.
- Avoid high heat drying to preserve the shape.
- Store flat when not in use.

Stitch Summary

Throughout both projects, only these stitches are used:

- Chain (ch)
- Single Crochet (sc)
- Slip Stitch (sl st)
- Back Loop Only Single Crochet (BLO sc)

This simple combination creates the clean texture, structured slipper shape, decorative scalloped edge, and ribbed washcloth shown in the stitch chart while keeping the pattern approachable from beginning to end.
