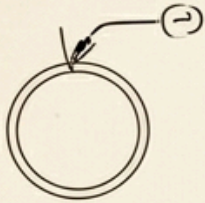


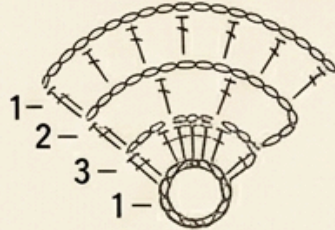
Crochet Vine Hair Snood Pattern

VINE-ACCENTED HAIR NET: FULL US CROCHET TUTORIAL

Section 1: The Foundation Net (Beige Yarn)



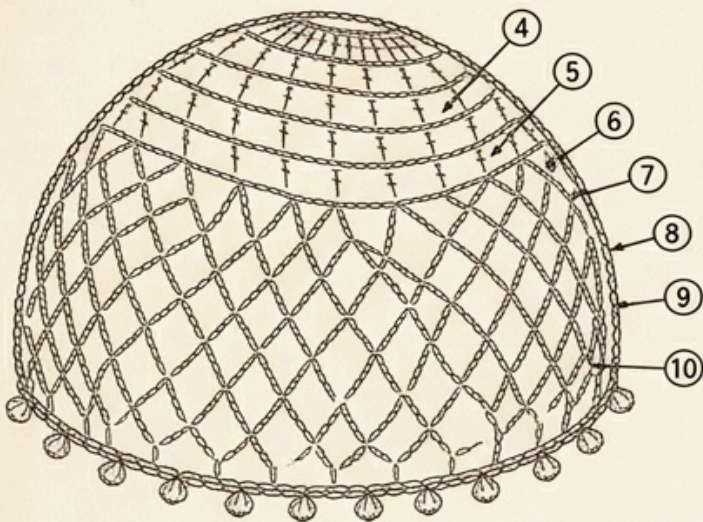
Round 1: Make a magic ring, ch 3, 11 dc, join (12 dc).



Round 3: Sl st to center of first ch-5 loop, [sc in loop, ch 5] repeat around, join.

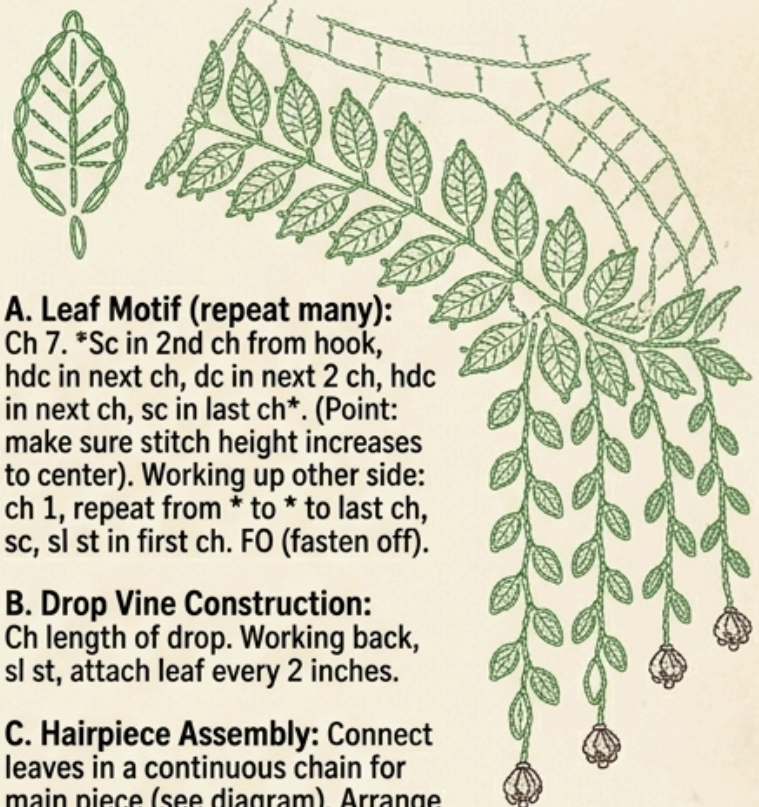


Section 2: Expanding the Net



Rounds 4-10: Continue repeating Round 3. For shape, increase ch-5 loops every few rounds as needed for cap size. Check fit periodically.

Section 3: The Leafy Vines (Green Yarn)



A. Leaf Motif (repeat many):

Ch 7. *Sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next 2 ch, hdc in next ch, sc in last ch*. (Point: make sure stitch height increases to center). Working up other side: ch 1, repeat from * to * to last ch, sc, sl st in first ch. FO (fasten off).

B. Drop Vine Construction:

Ch length of drop. Working back, sl st, attach leaf every 2 inches.

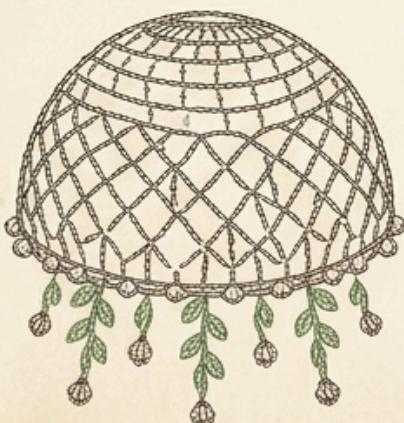
C. Hairpiece Assembly:

Connect leaves in a continuous chain for main piece (see diagram). Arrange main chain around the base of the hair net and attach with small green sl sts. Attach multiple drop vines to the back.

Section 4: Finishing Touches (Accent Yarn)

A. Bobble Edge: Use light yarn on the bottom edge of the hair net. (Sc, bobble in next stitch) repeat. *Bobble definition in US Terms Legend*.

B. Tassel Beads: Add small beads to the end of each vine drop.

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Create a graceful crochet hair snood adorned with cascading leafy vines, inspired by vintage botanical lace. This elegant accessory combines a structured mesh hair net with delicate fern-like leaves and hanging vine accents, making it perfect for everyday wear, historical costumes, cottagcore fashion, weddings, or special occasions.

This pattern follows US crochet terminology and is written with detailed instructions so you can complete the project from beginning to end with confidence.

Skill Level

Intermediate

Confident beginners can complete this project by working carefully and following each section in order.

Finished Size

Approximately:

- Hair Net Diameter: 9–11 inches (23–28 cm)
- Hanging Vine Length: 4–10 inches (10–25 cm)

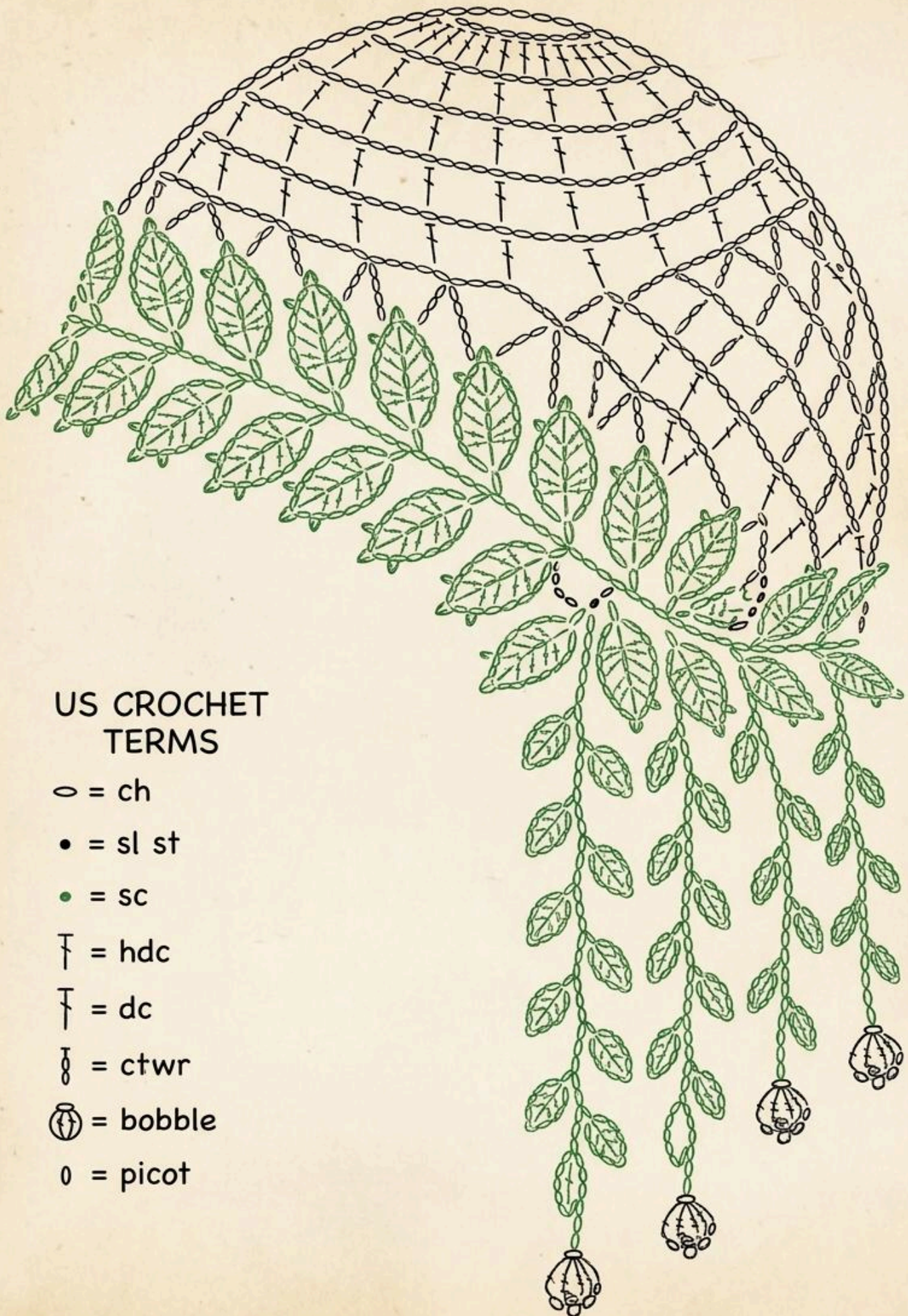
The size can be adjusted by adding or removing mesh rounds.

Materials

- Sport Weight (#2) or Fine Weight (#1) cotton yarn
- 3.0 mm crochet hook (D/3)
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Stitch markers (optional)

US Crochet Abbreviations

- ch = chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- bobble = bobble stitch
- picot = ch 3, sl st in first chain

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Pattern Notes

The snood is worked from the center outward.

The circular mesh gradually increases to create a rounded shape that comfortably holds the hair.

Once the mesh is complete, leafy vines are crocheted directly onto the lower edge.

No sewing is required.

Keep your chain stitches relaxed so the mesh remains flexible.

Step 1 – Make the Center Ring

Ch 6.

Join with a sl st to form a ring.

Round 1:

Ch 3 (counts as dc).

Work 15 dc into the ring.

Join with a sl st.

(16 dc)

Step 2 – Begin the Mesh

Ch 5.

Skip next stitch.

Sc in next stitch.

Repeat around.

Join with a sl st into the beginning chain.

You should now have evenly spaced chain loops.

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Step 3 – Expand the Hair Net

Sl st into the first chain space.

Ch 6.

Sc into the next chain space.

Repeat around.

Each round increases naturally as the mesh expands.

Continue working additional rounds until the circle measures approximately 5 inches.

Step 4 – Shape the Snood

Continue crocheting mesh rounds.

Alternate between:

- Ch 5 loops
- Ch 6 loops

This creates the gentle dome shape needed for the hair net.

Work until the finished diameter measures approximately 9–11 inches.

Fasten off only if changing colors.

Otherwise continue directly into the edging.

Step 5 – Reinforce the Edge

Work one round of sc evenly around the entire outer edge.

This strengthens the opening and helps the snood maintain its shape.

Do not pull the stitches tightly.

The edge should remain flexible.

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Step 6 – Begin the Hanging Vines

Attach yarn at any point along the lower edge.

Ch 18–30 depending on the desired vine length.

Sl st back into the edge.

Repeat every 1–2 inches around the lower half of the snood.

Vary the vine lengths for a natural appearance.

Step 7 – Crochet the Fern Leaves

Beginning at the end of one vine:

Ch 6.

Work back along the chain:

- 1 sc
- 2 hdc
- 2 dc

Sl st into the vine.

Skip one stitch.

Repeat on alternating sides of the vine until reaching the snood.

Each leaf should angle slightly away from the stem, creating a soft fern-like appearance.

Step 8 – Add Smaller Side Vines

Between the longer vines, attach shorter vines.

Ch 10–16.

Work miniature leaves using:

- Ch 5
- Sc
- Hdc
- Dc

Sl st back into the vine.

Repeat until complete.

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These shorter vines fill the design without adding too much weight.

Step 9 – Optional Decorative Buds

At the end of selected vines:

Ch 4.

Work 5 dc into the first chain.

Join with a sl st.

Work one bobble in the center.

Finish with one picot beneath the flower.

Fasten off.

Repeat on only a few vines for a delicate botanical effect.

Step 10 – Final Finishing

Fasten off all yarn ends securely.

Weave in every tail using a yarn needle.

Lightly steam block if using cotton yarn.

Shape each vine by hand.

Allow the vines to drape naturally around the edge of the snood.

Customization Ideas

- Use two or three shades of green for realistic foliage.
- Add tiny pearl beads to the flower buds.
- Crochet longer vines for a dramatic look.
- Make shorter vines for everyday wear.
- Use metallic thread for an elegant evening accessory.
- Add satin ribbon around the edge for a vintage-inspired finish.

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Tips for Success

- Keep your chain stitches loose to maintain flexibility.
- Space the vines evenly around the lower half of the snood.
- Vary vine lengths to create a more natural appearance.
- Block the finished piece gently to open the mesh and define the lace.
- Store the snood flat to preserve its shape.
